- Original opening 1960 under International Paper Company ownership
- International Paper Company donated land 2013 (Act of Donation on record)
- We would like to acknowledge the federal Sport Fish Restoration Program for providing funding for the construction and renovation, of this facility. Completed in 2019.
- Sport Fish Restoration (SFR) funds support on-going LDWF management (stocking, monitoring, access); SFR logo can be found in digital media portal
- Morehouse Innovation and Technology Alliance (MITA) partnership 100% funding for kids' pier (in-progress)
- Partnerships with Keep Morehouse Beautiful and the Chamber of Commerce

- Description of site improvements (Sport Fish Restoration Funds)
 - New launch and mooring dock
 - Wave Breaks for pier/launch area protection
 - Boat lanes and markers for safety
 - o Pier construction for access enhancement

 - Kids pier will be located at northeast gate
 - Small pier is located at southeast gate

Regulations

- Primary objective is to provide an exceptional and unique fishery to both shoreline and boat anglers. Emphasis on high catch rates of largemouth bass and quality size crappie and sunfish.
- Special Regulations (length restrictions, creel limits)
 - Black Bass: 16 in. max. length; daily creel = 5; although you may have 1 fish > 16" long
 - o Crappie: 10 in. min. length; daily creel = 25
 - o Bream: daily creel = 50
 - o Rod-n-reel only
- State regulations are in effect for all other species. Regulations may be viewed at: www.wlf.louisiana.gov/page/seasons-and-regulations
- No hunting, commercial fishing, swimming or water skiing allowed

Boat and Kayak Launches

- Northeast Gate N32° 52′18.40″ W91° 54′87″ = boat launch, fishing pier, large parking area
- Southeast Gate N32° 50′50.85″ W91° 55′43.45″ = fishing pier, small parking area, kayak launch
