Temporary/Seasonal Wildlife Technician

We're on the hunt for a Temporary/Seasonal Wildlife Technician. This job opportunity is located in Lafayette in the Alligator Management Program. The time of employment is from approximately mid-March through October.

Job duties include travel statewide to measure, tag, and sack captive-raised juvenile alligators for release to the wild. Extensive travel is required approximately 3-4 days per week for most of the term of employment, with less travel during the month of June. Travel may occasionally require overnight stays; hotel accommodations and meal stipends are provided. The work involves extensive manual labor (tagging alligators, measuring alligators, putting live alligators in burlap sacks, tying the sack, and hauling loaded sacks to trailers). Transportation to sites away from LDWF office is provided (traveling with co-workers in department vehicles), but temporary/seasonal employees are responsible for their own transportation to the Lafayette office.

Less frequent activities may include computer data entry, assisting with alligator hide inspections, collecting data (sex ratio, lengths, re-trap information) from harvested alligators at check stations during the annual September harvest, and occasional opportunities for field research. Some routine maintenance and cleanup work may be needed (boats, vehicles, etc).

This is a temporary/seasonal position, thus no benefits such as vacation, annual leave, or insurance are awarded. This job is an entry level Wildlife Technician position. Applicants must take a pre-employment drug screening test.
