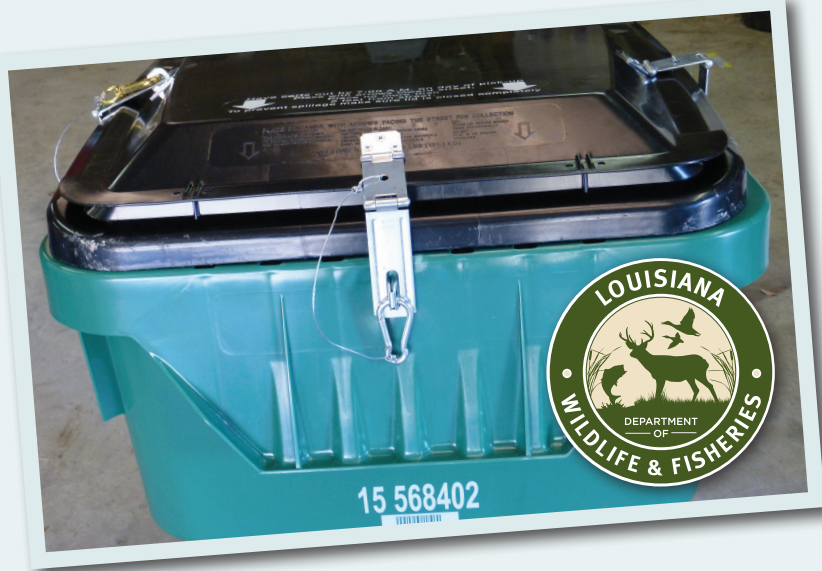


EASY DIY BEAR-RESISTANT TRASH CAN



Due to easy access of garbage from unsecured garbage cans bears have quickly acquired a taste for human food. In an effort to deter this nuisance bear behavior and stop the unintentional feeding of bears, please follow this simple DIY guide.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Two or three 4.5" double-hinged safety hasps with hardware (replace screws with appropriate sized bolts, locking nuts & washers)
- Two or three clips, quick snaps or carabiners
- An electric drill with drill bits
- Wrenches
- Chain, wire or string



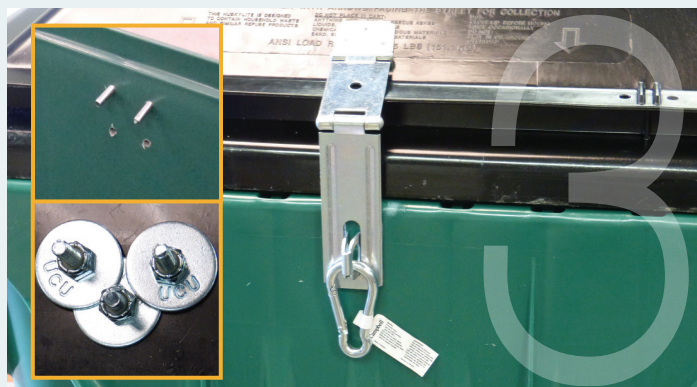
NOTE: Depending on the type of can, hasps may be attached either in the front or sides. It is recommended to attach hasps on the front and sides for best results.



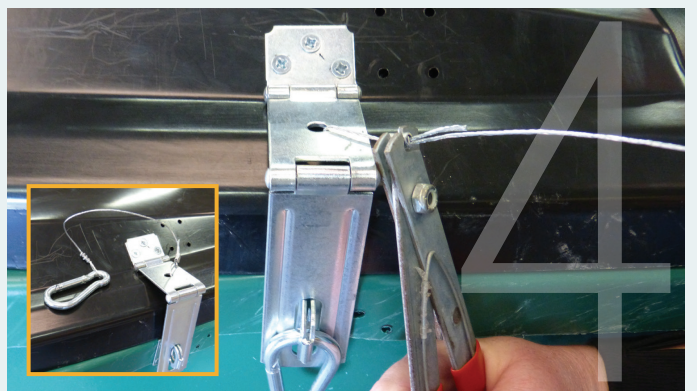
1 Mark desired placement of hinged hasps on two or three sides of the trash can.



2 Use the drill to make pilot holes.



3 Attach the hasp and latch plate to bottom lip and lid of can. Each component is secured by placing bolts through pilot holes and securing with washers and locking nuts.



4 To lock can, place clip, quick snap or carabiner through latch plate after hasp is in place. Use chain, wire or string as pictured to avoid losing or misplacing clips, quick snaps or carabiners.
