MAJOR CHANGES FOR 2022-2023 HUNTING REGULATIONS

1. Licensing changes (*pages 6-9*):

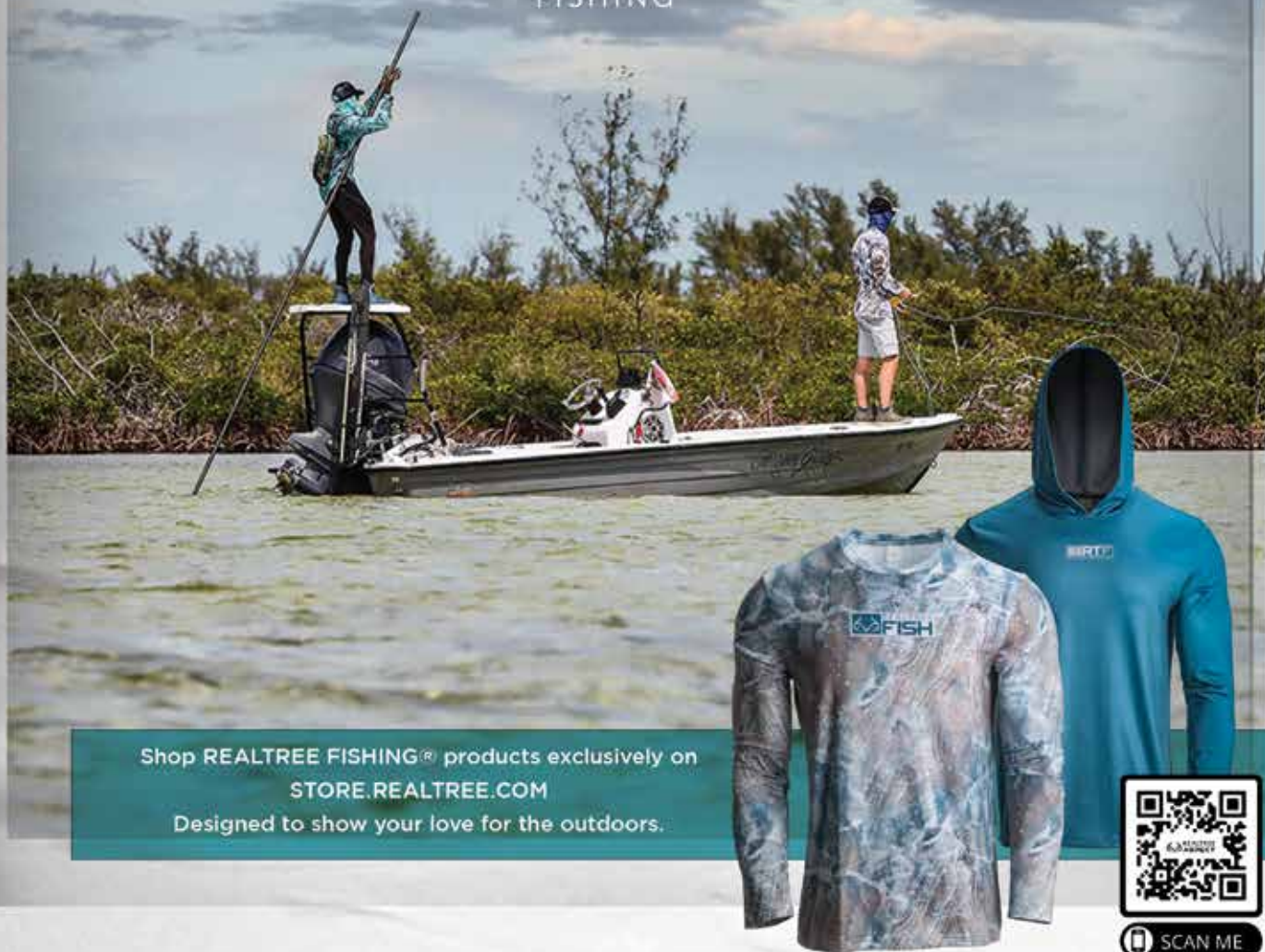
- Change to license fees; see fee tables for details.
 - Change to license validity period from June 1-30 to 365 days from the date of purchase.
 - Changing the big game license to individual licenses for deer and turkey.
 - Change to senior hunt/fish licenses.
 - Change to the lifetime licenses; see fee table for details.
 - New requirement that all LDWF owned and administered land will require a WMA access permit for all activities (*page 45*).
 - New requirement that all persons camping on a LDWF-operated WMA campground must have a WMA camping permit (*page 48*).
 - Addition of hunting guide license.
 - Addition of youth license.
 - Change to permit requirements for use of department administered lands including wildlife refuges and wildlife management and habitat conservation areas.
 - New option for those purchasing a license to donate and help provide disabled veterans with hunting and fishing licenses.
2. Addition of electronic tagging for deer and turkey (*pages 20 & 30*).
 3. Opening all of Caddo Parish to turkey hunting in Turkey Area B (*page 29*).
 4. Establishment of a Limited Use Area on Bodcau WMA (*page 54*).
 5. Addition of youth lottery turkey hunting days on Clear Creek and West Bay WMAs (*pages 55 & 65*).
 6. Elimination of modern firearm either-sex deer days on Joyce, Maurepas Swamp and Salvador/Timken WMAs (*pages 57, 59 & 62*).
 7. Change in Archery season dates on Tunica Hills WMA (*page 65*).

1 Deer Hunting: Required of all deer hunters in addition to Basic Season License. This license includes deer tags, archery, and primitive privileges.

2 Waterfowl Hunting: Required of all waterfowl hunters in addition to Basic Season License.

3 Turkey Hunting: Required of all turkey hunters in addition to Basic Season License. This license includes turkey tags and archery.

4 Youth License: Any resident or non-resident under the age of 18 must obtain a youth license for hunting deer, turkey, trapping, and youth lottery hunts. This license includes deer and turkey tags. No ID or proof of residency is required for the purchase of this license. The youth license is not required when hunting squirrels, rabbits, or woodcock.

5 Federal Electronic Duck Stamp: The Federal Electronic Duck Stamp allows customers to buy Federal Duck Stamps online for immediate use. The electronic stamp is valid for 45 days from the date of purchase. Customers should receive their physical stamp within this period. If you have not received your Federal Duck Stamp, please contact Amplex at 1-800-852-4897 or duckstamp@amplex.com

6 Harvest Information Program (HIP): Licensed hunters of migratory game birds (doves, ducks, geese, woodcock, rails, snipe, coots or gallinules) in Louisiana must be HIP certified in addition to all other requirements.

7 WMA Access: Either a WMA Access Annual or 5-Day Permit is required for all users of LDWF administered lands, including wildlife management areas, refuges, and wetlands conservation areas. Persons 17 and under are not required to purchase WMA permits.

8 WMA Camping Permit: A WMA Camping Permit is required for each camping party utilizing a LDWF-operated campground on a WMA. A camping party is defined as one to five individuals 18 or older. If any camping group is over five individuals 18 or older, then multiple WMA Camping Permits are required. Youths 17 and younger are exempt from the WMA Camping Permit requirement. The WMA Camping Permit(s) or camping permit number shall be displayed at each camping party's campsite. A campsite is defined as any tent, RV, camper, vehicle or site occupied within a campground or vessel/houseboat moored adjacent to a campground.

9 Sportsman's Paradise License: includes Basic and Saltwater Fishing, Basic Hunting Season, Deer Hunting, Turkey Hunting, Waterfowl Hunting, LA Duck, WMA Access, and all Recreational Gear licenses (EXCEPT recreational trawls greater than 25 feet in length - additional license required)

10 Hunting Guide: license is valid for one year, beginning on July 1 of each calendar year and expiring on June 30 of the following calendar year.

LICENSING

Hunting and recreational fishing E-license may be purchased at LouisianaOutdoors.com. The E-license can be printed using a personal printer for immediate use or saved to an electronic device which is kept in possession while hunting. Methods of payment are Visa, MasterCard, & Discover. A convenience fee is assessed.

Lifetime hunting licenses include basic hunting, deer hunting, waterfowl hunting, turkey hunting, and WMA Access Permit.

Lifetime licenses are available from the Baton Rouge office only. Allow three weeks processing time. Applicants are required to have lived in Louisiana for the immediate 6 months prior to making application to qualify for resident rates. Mandatory documents required with application for applicants under 18 are a birth certificate and a copy of both par-

ents' drivers licenses. Mandatory documents required with application for anyone 18 and older are a valid LA driver's license issued a minimum of 6 months **and one of the following:**

1. Louisiana voter's registration card
2. Louisiana vehicle registration or
3. Two previous year's state tax filing, stamped by Department of Revenue and Taxation.

LICENSE EXCEPTIONS & EXEMPTIONS

MILITARY

Military licenses are valid only during that time when the licensee is on active duty in the armed forces of the United States.

Any resident or nonresident who possesses a military identification card that signifies that he or she is currently on active duty with any branch of the armed forces of the United States, including the National Guard, or the spouse or dependent of such person, may be issued a license for hunting or recreational fishing in Louisiana for the same fee as that required of Louisiana residents. The military identification card or dependent card and the appropriate license must be on the licensee's person at all times when he is engaged in hunting and fishing activities.

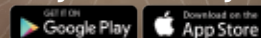
Any person who possesses a military identification card that signifies that he is currently on active duty with any one of the armed forces of the United States, including the National Guard, or the spouse or dependent of such person, may be issued a license for hunting or recreational fishing in Louisiana for the same fee as that required of Louisiana residents. The military identification card or dependent card and the appropriate license must be on the licensee's person at all times when he is engaged in hunting and fishing activities.

Resident veterans having a permanent service-connected disability classification of 50 percent or more and residents who are blind, paraplegic or multiple amputee shall upon identification and proof of disability satisfactory to LDWF, be issued sports hunting license without the payment of any fees thereof. Contact Sports License at 225-765-2887 for required forms.

VETERAN BONA FIDE RESIDENCY

Effective Aug. 1, 2019, a Louisiana Resident who was honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States or a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States, including the National Guard, for the purposes of purchasing a fishing/hunting license will be considered a bona fide resident of Louisiana once he/she possess a Louisiana driver's license, or, if not licensed to drive, is in possession of a special identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections under the provisions of R.S. 40:1321

SOCIAL SECURITY, RAILROAD, STATE AND PUBLIC SUBDIVISION DISABILITY RETIREMENT RECIPIENTS

A resident who is totally and permanently disabled and receiving a disability social security benefit may submit a current award letter from Social Security (SSI does not qualify) and a valid Louisiana driver's license to qualify. A resident who receives disability retirement income from a retirement system whose members are exempt from federal social security, either pursuant to the Railroad Retirement Insurance Act, 45 U.S.C. 231, or because they are

employees of a state or a political subdivision of the state that has not voluntarily agreed to participate in federal social security under 42 U.S.C. 418, may qualify to purchase a Disabled/Special Needs License for \$4. Contact the licensing staff at (225) 765-2887 for required documents.

BONA FIDE RESIDENT

Any person who has resided in this state continuously during the 6 months immediately prior to the date on which he or she applies for any license and who has manifested his or her intent to remain in this state by establishing Louisiana as his or her legal domicile, as demonstrated by compliance with all of the following, as applicable:

- If registered to vote, he or she is registered to vote in Louisiana.
- If licensed to drive a motor vehicle, he or she is in possession of a valid Louisiana drivers license.
- If owning a motor vehicle located within Louisiana, he or she is in possession of a valid Louisiana registration for that vehicle.
- If earning an income, he or she has filed a Louisiana state income tax return and has complied with state income tax laws and regulations.

GENERAL HUNTING INFO

GENERAL HUNTING INFORMATION

- A Basic Hunting License is required of all persons to hunt, take, possess or cause to be transported by any other person any wild bird or quadruped. *See page 8 for exceptions.*

Pursuant to Act 169 of the 1988 regular session of the Legislature, the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission has adopted monetary values which are assigned to all illegally taken, possessed, injured or destroyed fish, wild birds, wild quadrupeds and other

wildlife and aquatic life. Anyone taking, possessing, injuring or destroying fish, wild birds, wild quadrupeds and other wildlife and aquatic life shall be required to reimburse LDWF a sum of money equal to the value of the wildlife illegally taken, possessed, injured or destroyed. This monetary reimbursement shall be in addition to any and all criminal penalties imposed for the illegal act.

HUNTER EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

No person born on or after Sept. 1, 1969, shall hunt unless that person has been issued a certificate of satisfactory completion of a Hunter Education course approved by LDWF.

- **EXCEPT** a person may hunt without hunter education certification if 1.) they are accompanied by and under direct supervision of a person who was born before Sept. 1, 1969 and has a valid hunting license, or 2.) they are accompanied by and under the direct supervision of a person who is 18 years of age or older and has proof of completion of a hunter education course approved by

LDWF. Direct supervision means that the person being supervised is within a normal audible voice contact and in direct line of sight of the supervising person at all times while hunting.

- **EXCEPT** this requirement shall not apply to any active or veteran member of the United States Armed Services or any POST-certified law enforcement officer who has been issued a hunter education exemption. Application and instructions to apply for this exemption can be found at www.wlf.la.gov/page/hunter-and-trapper-education.

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE



2022 UPDATES: Important Deer Regulation Information

The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) continues to monitor and test the state's white-tailed deer herd for chronic wasting disease (CWD). In 2022, Louisiana became the 29th state to detect CWD. It had been previously detected in Texas, Arkansas and Mississippi.

Transport and Possession Regulations for Deer Being Harvested Out-of-State

HELP PREVENT THE IMPORTATION AND SPREAD OF CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

Import regulations have been implemented in an effort to reduce the spread of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). Louisiana and 40 other states have implemented similar transport regulations in an effort to slow further spread. CWD has been detected in 30 states and four Canadian provinces. Hunters returning to Louisiana can help prevent the spread of CWD by complying with cervid carcass import regulations.

Members of the family Cervidae include but are not limited to white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, moose, caribou, fallow deer, axis deer, sika deer, red deer, and reindeer.

This restriction shall also prohibit transport of any cervid carcass or part of a cervid carcass originating from Louisiana lands east of the Mississippi River in East Carroll, Madison, Tensas and Concordia parishes to any other part of the state, unless it is transported in the manner prescribed herein. Any and all bones shall be disposed of in a manner where its final destination is at an approved landfill or equivalent. In addition, approved parts or deboned meat transported from other states must be legally possessed from the state it was taken. Approved parts and deboned meat from other states must contain a possession tag with the hunter's name, out-of-state license number (if required), address, species, date and location (county and state) of harvest. All cervids transported into or through Louisiana that are in violation of the provisions of this ban shall be seized and disposed of in accordance with the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission and Department of Wildlife and Fisheries rules and regulations.

CWD CERVID CARCASS IMPORT REGULATIONS

No person shall import, transport or possess any cervid carcass or part of a cervid carcass originating outside of Louisiana, except for

- meat that is cut and wrapped
- meat that has been boned out
- quarters or other portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached
- antlers
- clean skull plates with antlers
- cleaned skulls without tissue attached
- capes
- tanned hides
- finished taxidermy mounts
- cleaned cervid teeth

WHAT IS CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE?

CWD is a neurodegenerative disease found in most deer species, including but not limited to white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, red deer, moose and caribou. It is infectious, always fatal and there is no treatment. It's part of a group of diseases known as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSEs) and is similar to BSE (mad cow disease) of cattle and scrapie in sheep. These diseases cause irreversible damage to brain tissue which leads to excessive salivation, neurological symptoms, emaciation and death of the animal.

HAS IT BEEN FOUND IN LOUISIANA'S WHITE-TAILED DEER POPULATION?

CWD has been detected in Louisiana. In addition, Arkansas, Mississippi, and Texas have detected it. The disease has been documented in 30 states and four Canadian provinces. LDWF has been monitoring and testing for CWD since 2002 and has checked more than 13,000 deer. The state's first positive was detected in 2022.

WHAT CAUSES CWD AND HOW IS IT SPREAD?

CWD is caused by prions, which are proteins normally found in the body that have mutated. These prions accumulate in the brain and cause holes to develop in brain tissue. While prions are concentrated in the central nervous system, they can be found within other tissues of the infected animal, including muscle.

CWD is spread through direct deer-to-deer contact or through contact with urine, feces, saliva and body parts of infected deer or infectious materials in the soil. Prions will bind to soil particles once an infected deer carcass has decomposed. Once in a location, the disease is present indefinitely.

WHAT SIGNS DO DEER WITH CWD DISPLAY?

Prions can be shed within 6 months of infection, but it can take one to two years for CWD to incubate and exhibit outward symptoms in the infected animal. Symptoms include emaciation, lethargy, abnormal behavior, and loss of bodily functions. Other signs include excessive salivation, loss of appetite, progressive weight loss, excessive thirst and urination, teeth grinding and drooping ears.

CAN HUMANS CONTRACT CWD?

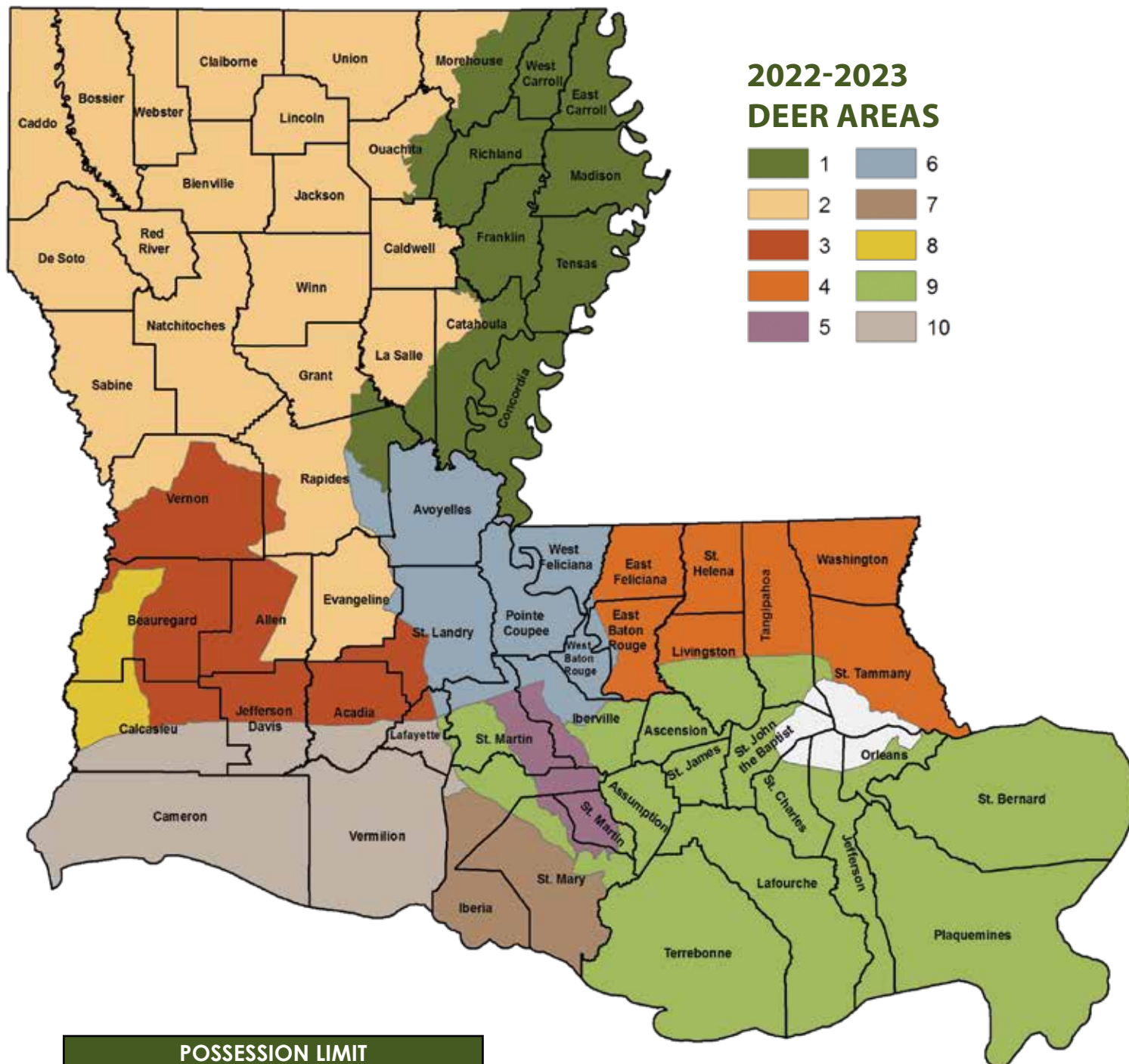
According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) there is no evidence that CWD can infect humans. However, the CDC recommends caution in handling venison in the infected region and that deer be tested for CWD before consuming. CWD positive deer should not be consumed by people.

HOW CAN I REPORT A SUSPECT DEER?

You can assist LDWF in disease surveillance by reporting any deer that exhibits CWD symptoms. Suspect deer should be reported to the nearest LDWF field office.

DEER HUNTING SCHEDULES

Shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. Consult Wildlife Management Area and Federal Land schedules for specific regulations and dates on those areas.

6 per season, not to exceed 3 antlered OR 4 antlerless per season EXCEPT Deer Area 4 limit 3/season (not to exceed 2 antlered or 2 antlerless deer), and Deer Area 10 limit 3/season (not to exceed 2 antlered or 2 antlerless deer).

DEER HUNTING

DEER TAGGING INFORMATION (2022-2023)

Prior to hunting deer, all deer hunters, regardless of age or license status, must obtain **either carcass or electronic deer tags for the current season**. Tags must be in possession when hunting deer. Hunters purchasing licenses online at www.wlf.la.gov/page/hunting-licenses-permits-tags will be able to print an E-License using a personal printer for immediate use, email or save the licenses purchased to an electronic device which is kept in possession while hunting.

PROCESS FOR TAGGING DEER

1. Immediately upon harvesting a deer, the hunter must tag the deer with the appropriate carcass **or electronic** tag before it is moved from the harvest site.
2. The hunter must record the date of kill for the corresponding tag number on the harvest report card portion of the deer tag license **or report the harvest electronically**.
3. The hunter must record the date and parish of kill on the carcass tag **or report this information electronically**.
4. The tag must remain attached to the deer while kept at camp, or while it is transported to the domicile of the hunter or to a cold storage facility. Hunters who keep the carcass or meat at camp must also comply with the resident game possession tag regulations (*see Possession Tags on page 71*).
5. Within **72 hours** the hunter must validate the harvest. Hunters may validate deer **by utilizing text-to-tag, tagging through the LDWF web portal or the LDWF web portal via LA Wallet or by calling the validation toll free number, 225-267-9998 or using the validation website: www.LouisianaOutdoors.com**.

Hunters harvesting deer on DMAP lands should follow the instructions provided to them by LDWF.

REPLACEMENT OF LOST TAGS

Duplicate tags are available to replace lost tags. Tags can be reprinted online at www.wlf.la.gov/page/hunting-licenses-permits-tags no cost. If duplicate tags are applied for at the retail location, there is a \$2 charge to the hunter. Hunters that have harvested deer prior to losing their remaining tags must remove and discard the duplicate tags to account for the original tags that have been used and validated. Hunters must record these validated deer on the duplicate deer tag license.

DEER HUNTING REGULATIONS

AREAS NOT SPECIFICALLY DESIGNATED AS OPEN ARE CLOSED.

METHODS OF TAKING DEER

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

Basic Hunting License, **Deer License** (or equivalent combination license) and Deer Tags are required of all persons 18 and older hunting deer. **Youth Hunting License and Deer Tags are required of all persons 17 and younger hunting deer. A resident who reaches age 60 between June 1, 2000 and May 31, 2022, may obtain an annual Senior Hunting and Fishing License for the cost of \$5.00. See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.**

DEFINITIONS

- **Either-sex:** Antlered or antlerless deer.
- **Still Hunting:** Stalking or stationary stand hunting without the use of dog(s).
- **Antlered Deer:** Deer with at least one visible antler, of hardened bony material, broken naturally through the skin.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

(Additional prohibited activities listed under Archery and Primitive Firearms seasons)

- Using or possessing scents or lures that contain natural deer urine or other bodily fluids while taking, attempting to take, attracting or scouting wildlife, **EXCEPT** natural deer urine products produced by manufacturers or entities that are actively enrolled and participating in the Responsible Hunting Scent Association or the Archery Trade Association Deer Protection Program, and which products have been tested and certified that no detectable levels of CWD are present, and clearly labeled as such.
- Take or possession of spotted fawns.
- Take of deer with firearms smaller than .22 caliber center-fire or shotgun loaded with anything other than buckshot or slug.

- Take of deer with rimfire firearms.
- Take of deer while deer are swimming.
- Take of deer while hunter is in a boat with motor attached in operating position, **EXCEPT** that this prohibition shall not apply to any person who has lost one or more limbs.
- Take of game quadrupeds or birds from aircraft, or participating in the taking of deer with the aid of aircraft or from any other moving vehicles.
- Pursuing, driving or hunting deer with dogs or moving vehicles when or where a still hunting season or area is designated.
- Training of deer dogs in still hunting areas during open still hunting seasons.

DAILY LIMIT

- One antlered and one antlerless deer per day **EXCEPT** when a Bucks Only season is in progress and **EXCEPT** on Floy Ward McElroy WMA and **EXCEPT** on some Federal Lands where the daily limit is one deer per day (see specific Federal Lands Regulations for details).

SEASON LIMIT

- **Season limit is six, not to exceed three antlered OR four antlerless deer, EXCEPT** Deer Area 4 season limit is three (not to exceed two antlered or two antlerless deer), and **EXCEPT** Deer Area 10 season limit is three (not to exceed two antlered or two antlerless deer). Deer harvested on property enrolled in DMAP may not count in the **season or daily** bag limit for hunters. See DMAP Regulations (LAC 76:v.111) for more information.

DEER HUNTING

POSSESSION TAGS

Any part of a deer divided shall have affixed thereto the name, date, address and LDWF number of the person who harvested the deer and the sex of that animal. This information shall be legibly written in pen or pencil on any piece of paper or cardboard or any material which is attached or secured to or enclosing the part or parts. *(Resident Game Possession Tags are provided on page 71 and may be used for such purposes).*

SEX IDENTIFICATION

Positive evidence of sex identification, including the head or sex organs, shall remain on any deer taken in Louisiana, so long as such deer is kept in camp or field, or is in route to the domicile of its possessor, or until a deer has been appropriately tagged and validated, and **the proof of electronic or** physical tag remains with the carcass, or until such deer has been stored at the domicile of its possessor or divided at a cold storage facility and has thus become identifiable as food rather than as wild game.

USE OF DOGS FOR TRAILING AND RETRIEVAL OF DEER

A leashed dog may be used to trail and retrieve wounded or un-recovered deer. Any leashed dog used to trail or retrieve wounded or un-recovered deer must wear a collar bearing the owner's name, address and phone number.

HUNTER ORANGE AND BLAZE PINK

Any person hunting any wildlife during the open firearms deer hunting season and possessing buckshot, slugs, a primitive firearm, or a centerfire firearm shall display on their head, chest and/or back a total of not less than 400 square inches of "Hunter Orange" or "Blaze Pink."

EXCEPTIONS

- Persons hunting on privately owned land may wear a Hunter Orange or Blaze Pink cap or hat in lieu of the 400 square inches.
- Not required of persons hunting deer from elevated stands on property that is privately owned. However, anyone hunting deer on such lands where hunting with firearms is allowed shall be required to display the 400 square inches or a Hunter Orange or Blaze Pink cap or hat while walking to and from elevated stands.
- Not required of archery deer hunters hunting on lands where firearm hunting is not allowed by agreement of the landowner or lessee.

WARNING: *Deer hunters are cautioned to watch for persons hunting other game or engaged in activities not requiring "Hunter Orange" or "Blaze Pink."*

PRIMITIVE FIREARMS SEASON

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

- A **Deer or Senior License, whichever is appropriate**, is required of all persons hunting deer with primitive firearms during Primitive Firearms Seasons. **Persons 17 and under must possess a valid, original youth license.** See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Hunting with dogs (All Primitive Firearms Seasons are still hunt only).

LEGAL GEAR

Legal Gear for Primitive Firearms Season includes:

- Rifles or pistols, .44 caliber minimum, or shotguns 10 gauge or smaller, all of which must load exclusively from the muzzle, use black powder or approved substitute only, take ball, shot, or bullet projectile only, including sabot bullets. All of the above may be fitted with magnified scopes.

- Single shot, breech loading rifles or single shot, breech loading pistols, .35 caliber or larger, having an exposed hammer that use metallic cartridges loaded either with black powder or modern smokeless powder. All of the above may be fitted with magnified scopes.
- Single shot, breech loading shotguns, 10 gauge or smaller, having an exposed hammer, loaded with buckshot or slug.

EXCEPTIONS

- Youths 17 or younger may hunt deer with any legal weapon during the Primitive Firearms Season in each deer hunting area.

Either-sex deer may be taken in all areas open for deer hunting **EXCEPT** when a Bucks Only season is in progress. In such cases, hunters must conform to the bucks only regulations.

ARCHERY SEASON

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

- A **Deer License or Senior License, whichever is appropriate**, is required of all persons hunting deer with archery gear during Archery Seasons. **Persons 17 and under must possess a Youth License.** See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Possession or use any poisoned or drugged arrow or arrows with explosive tips.
- Hunting deer with a bow having a draw weight less than 30 lbs.
- Hunting with a bow or crossbow fitted with an infrared, laser sight, electrically operated sight or device specifically designed to

enhance vision at night (does NOT include non-projecting red dot sights; RS 56:116.1.(b)(4)).

- Hunting with dogs (All Archery Seasons are still hunt only).

LEGAL GEAR


Legal Gear for Archery Season includes:

- Traditional bow, compound bow, crossbow, or any bow drawn, held or released by mechanical means.

Either-sex deer may be taken in all areas open for deer hunting **EXCEPT** when a Bucks Only season is in progress. In such cases, archers must conform to the bucks only regulations.

DEER HUNTING

PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED SEASON ON PRIVATE LAND

Oct. 1-2, either-sex.

Restricted to individuals with Physically Challenged Hunter Permit. Permit applications are available at regional LDWF offices.

YOUTH AND HONORABLY DISCHARGED VETERANS SEASON ON PRIVATE LAND

Either-sex

Areas 1, 4, 5, 6 & 9: Oct. 29 - Nov. 4

Area 2: Oct. 8-14

Areas 3, 7, 8 & 10: Sept. 24-30

Restricted to youths 17 or younger only and resident honorably discharged veterans. All legal gear for archery, primitive firearms, and modern firearms allowed.

Youths must possess a hunter safety certification or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course. Youths must be accompanied by one adult 18 years of age or older. If the accompanying adult is in possession of hunter safety certification, a valid hunting license or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course, this requirement is waived for youths younger than 16 years of age. **Youths must possess a Youth License.** Adults may not possess a firearm. Youths may possess only one legal firearm while hunting. The supervising adult shall maintain visual and voice contact with the youth at all times, **EXCEPT** properly licensed youths 16-17 years old and youths 12 years old or older who have successfully completed a hunter safety course may hunt without a supervising adult.

DEER MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (DMAP)

Refer to LAC 76:V.111 or contact LDWF Field Offices for specific DMAP rules (www.wlf.la.gov/page/dmap). Deer management assistance tags must be in the possession of the hunter in order to harvest deer. The tag shall be attached in such a manner that it cannot be removed before the deer is transported (including those taken on either-sex days and those taken with approved archery equipment or primitive firearms). Depending upon the level of participation, antlerless or antlered deer harvested on property enrolled in DMAP may not count in the season or daily bag limit for hunters. DMAP participants must follow the deer season schedule established for their respective areas, **EXCEPT** antlerless deer may be harvested any day of the deer season on property enrolled in DMAP provided that a DMAP tag is possessed by the hunter at the time of harvest.

Resident veterans must be properly licensed and must possess proof of honorable discharge. One of the following must be carried by veterans while hunting:

- Louisiana OMV issued U.S. Veterans Driver's License.
- U.S. Department of Defense Form 214 or one of the following DD_214 equivalents:
 - i. Pre DD 214 era documents (1941_1950):
 - a. WD AGO (war department adjutant general) Forms, to include WD AGO 53, WD AGO 55, WD AGO 53_55; JAVPERS (naval personnel) discharge documents, to include NAVPERS 553, NAVMC78PD, NAVCG 553.
 - ii. National Personnel Records Center NPRC "statement of service," issued as a result of a destroyed discharge record during the 1973 National Archives fire.
 - iii. National Guard/Air National Guard must have NGB_22 with 6 or more years of service.

BOBCAT

SEASON: Experimental Year Round Season

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

- A **Basic Hunting License** is required of all persons hunting bobcat. See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Take of bobcat outside of legal shooting hours.

LIMIT

- One per calendar year.

LEGAL GEAR

- Firearms, archery equipment, and primitive firearms legal for deer.

EXCEPTIONS

- Licensed trappers may take bobcat during the open trapping season without possessing a **Basic Hunting License**.
- Regulation does not apply to state wildlife refuges or other federally owned refuges and lands.
- On state WMAs and Kisatchie National Forest the take of bobcat is restricted to those open seasons which require the respective legal gear noted above.

RACCOON AND OPOSSUM

SEASON: Year Round Season

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

- Basic Hunting License required of all persons hunting Raccoon and Opossum.
- A Trapping License is required to sell skins and carcasses during open trapping seasons. See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Selling of skins and carcasses without a valid Trapping License.
- Pelting or selling of skins and carcasses outside of the open trapping season.
- Hunting from boats or motor vehicles.
- Hunting or taking furbearing animals at night with artificial light **EXCEPT** it is legal to hunt or take raccoon or opossum at night with lights, provided such hunting or take is conducted with the use of one or more dogs (R.S. 56:116.C.1).

DAILY LIMIT

- Two raccoon and two opossum per day or night (see exception for open trapping season).

LEGAL GEAR

- During daylight hours:
 - Rimfire firearms .22 caliber or smaller.
 - Muzzleloading firearm .36 caliber or smaller.
 - Legal archery gear
 - Air rifles
 - Shotguns only during daylight hours.
- During nighttime hours:
 - Rimfire firearms .22 caliber or smaller.

EXCEPTIONS

- No daily limit for nighttime or daytime raccoon or opossum during the open trapping season **EXCEPT** on certain WMAs as listed.

NUTRIA

SEASON: Sept. 1 - Feb. 28. See exception below for certain WMAs.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Possession of detached nutria parts, including nutria tails, by recreational hunters.
- Pelting of recreationally harvested nutria.
- Sale of recreationally harvested nutria or any parts from recreationally harvested nutria.
- Leaving of recreationally harvested nutria carcass in the field, **EXCEPT** that nutria may be gutted.

DAILY LIMIT

- Five per day.

LEGAL GEAR

- Any gear on private lands. Shotguns with non-toxic shot only and rimfire rifles .22 caliber and smaller on WMAs.

EXCEPTIONS

- Nutria may be taken on Atchafalaya Delta, Salvador/Timken, Pointe-Aux-Chenes, and Pass-a-Loutre WMAs Sept. 1 - March 31.
- On WMAs during waterfowl seasons, nutria may be taken only by the use of shotguns with shot not larger than F steel.

The Coastwide Nutria Control Program is a separate program and is in no way related to the nutria recreational season. For questions on the Coastwide Nutria Control Program call the Lafayette field office: 337-262-2080.

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

- **Basic Hunting License for persons 18 and older** is required of all persons hunting quadrupeds and resident game birds. Additional licenses are required for deer and turkey. *See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.*

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Import, sell, use or possess scents or lures that contain natural deer urine or other bodily fluids, except natural deer urine products produced by manufacturers or entities that are actively enrolled and participating in the Responsible Hunting Scent Association or the Archery Trade Association Deer Protection Program, which has been tested using real-time quaking induced conversion (RT-QulC) and certified that no detectable levels of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) are present and is clearly labeled as such.
- Take of quadrupeds and resident game birds with a firearm fitted with an infrared sight, laser sight or EXCEPT as provided in R.S. 56:116 (A) (8) any sighting device which projects a beam of light to the target or otherwise electronically illuminates the target, or device specifically designed to enhance vision at night [R.S. 56:116.1(B)(3)(a-b)]. Any person who has been convicted of a class four or greater hunting violation for a period of five years after the date of such conviction shall not use a firearm fitted with a sound suppressor pursuant to R.S. 56:116.6.

- Intentionally feeding, depositing, placing, distributing, exposing, scattering, or causing to be fed, deposited, placed, distributed, exposed, or scattered, raw sweet potatoes to wild game quadrupeds.
- Use of shotguns larger than a 10 gauge or capable of holding more than three shells.
- Possession of shotguns in which the plug may be removed without disassembly.
- Take of game quadrupeds or birds from aircraft.
- Hunting or take of squirrel or rabbit with a breech-loaded rifle or handgun larger than .22 caliber, any centerfire rifle, or a muzzle-loading firearm larger than .36 caliber

LEGAL GEAR

- Legal archery gear or a shotgun not larger than a 10 gauge fired from the shoulder is legal for taking all resident game birds and quadrupeds.
- Handgun, rifle and falconry (special permit required) is legal for taking all game species **EXCEPT** turkey.
- Air rifles are legal for taking squirrels, rabbits, raccoons, opossum and outlaw quadrupeds.

Refer to game schedules contained within these regulations for specific gear restrictions.

NUISANCE ANIMALS

- Landowners or their designees may remove beaver and nutria causing damage to their property without a special permit. Water set traps and firearms may be used to remove beaver; nutria may be removed by any means (*see Nighttime Take of Nutria, Beaver & Outlaw Quadrupeds*).
- Any nuisance beaver or nutria trapped or shot outside open trapping season cannot be pelted or sold. A trapping license is required to sell or pelt nuisance beavers or nutria taken during open trapping season. Squirrel found destroying commercial crops of pecans may be taken year-round by permit issued by LDWF. Contact the local LDWF field office for details.

OUTLAW QUADRUPEDS (COYOTES, ARMADILLOS & FERAL HOGS)

Holders of a hunting license may take coyotes, feral hogs and armadillos year round during legal daylight shooting hours (for information on nighttime take see Nighttime Take of Nutria, Beaver & Outlaw Quadrupeds). The running of coyotes with dogs is prohibited in all turkey hunting areas during the open turkey season. Coyote hunting is restricted to chase only when using dogs during still hunting segments of the firearm and archery only seasons for deer. Foxes are protected quadrupeds and may be taken only with traps by licensed trappers during the trapping season. Remainder of the year "chase only" allowed by licensed hunters.

Persons using cage or corral traps to capture feral hogs must have a basic hunting license. Hog traps must have an opening in the top measuring at least 22 x 22 inches or 25 inches in diameter. Persons using snares to capture feral hogs must have a trapping license. Use of snares is not recommended in areas that have bears.

NIGHTTIME TAKE OF XNUTRIA, BEAVER & OUTLAW QUADRUPEDS

On private property, the landowner, or his lessee or agent with written permission and the landowner's contact information in his possession, may take outlaw quadrupeds, nutria or beaver during nighttime hours year round. However, no person shall be allowed to participate or be present during nighttime hunting activities if convicted of a class three or greater wildlife violation within the previous five years or if he has any other prohibition which would prevent the legal use of a firearm or participation in a hunting activity. Such taking may

be with or without the aid of artificial light, infrared or laser sighting devices, or night vision devices. Any person attempting to take outlaw quadrupeds, nutria or beaver under the provisions of this paragraph, shall notify the sheriff of the parish in which the property is located of his intention to attempt to take outlaw quadrupeds, nutria or beaver within 24 hours prior to the attempted taking or immediately upon taking the animal.

HUNTING AND/OR DISCHARGING FIREARMS ON PUBLIC ROADS

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Hunting, standing, loitering or shooting game quadrupeds or game birds while on a public road or public road right-of-way.
- Hunting or the discharge of firearms on roads or highways located on public levees or within 100 feet from the center line of such levee roads or highways.
- Spot-lighting or shining from public roads.

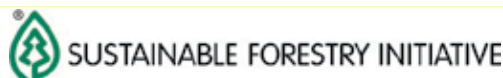

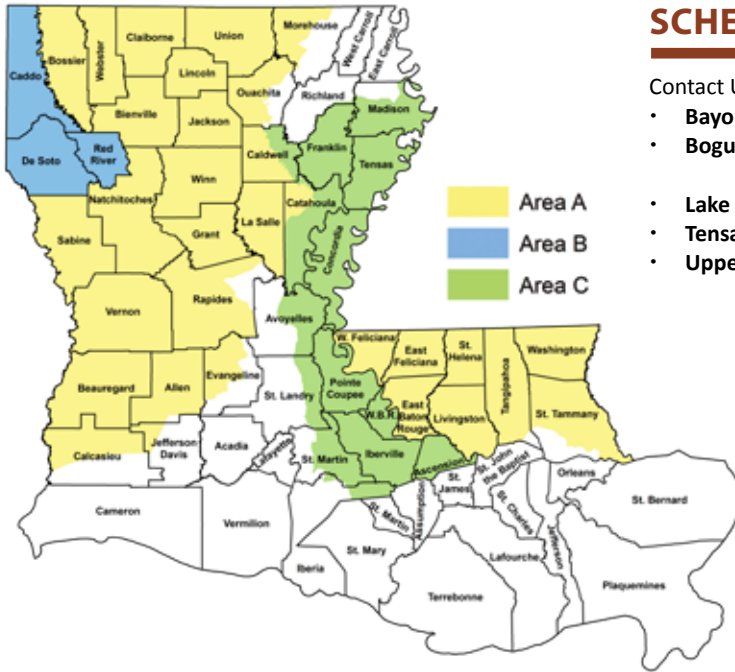

2023 TURKEY HUNTING REGULATIONS

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

Basic Hunting and Wild Turkey License (or equivalent combination license), and Turkey Tags are required of all persons 18 and older hunting turkey. Youth Hunting License and Turkey Tags are required of all persons 17 or younger hunting turkey. See page 8 for exceptions and exemptions.

DEFINITIONS

- **Baiting:** Placing, exposing, depositing or scattering of corn (shelled, shucked or unshucked), wheat or other grain, salt or other feed so as to constitute a lure, attraction or enticement to, on or over any areas where hunters are attempting to take turkeys.
- **Baited Area:** Any area where corn (shelled, shucked or unshucked), wheat or other grain, salt or other feed capable of luring, attracting or enticing turkeys is directly or indirectly placed, exposed, deposited, distributed or scattered. Such areas remain baited areas for 15 days following complete removal of all such corn, wheat or other grain, salt or other feed. Wildlife agents are authorized to close such baited areas and to place signs in the immediate vicinity designating closed zones and dates of closures.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Take of hens (including bearded hens).
- Use of dogs, baiting, electronic calling devices and live decoys.
- Use of motorized decoys.
- Take of turkey from a moving or stationary vehicle.
- Shotguns capable of holding more than three shells.
- Hunting, trapping or taking of turkey by the aid of baiting or on or over a baited area (See above definition of baiting).
- Hunting turkey within 200 yards of a baited area (See above definition of baited area).
- Take of live wild turkeys or their eggs from the wild.
- Possession of captive live wild turkeys or their eggs, regardless of origin, without a valid game breeder license.

DAILY LIMIT

One gobbler per day.

SEASON LIMIT

Two gobblers per season.

LEGAL GEAR

- Shotguns, including muzzleloading shotguns, using shot not larger than #2 lead, #2 non-toxic, or BB steel shot, and being no larger than 10 gauge.
- Traditional bow, compound bow, and crossbow, or any bow drawn, held or released by mechanical means.

YOUTH SEASON

Restricted to youths 17 or younger. Youths must possess a hunter safety certification or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course. **Youths must possess a valid, original Youth License.** Youths must be accompanied by one adult 18 years of age or older. If the accompanying adult is in possession of hunter safety certification, a valid hunting license or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course, this requirement is waived for youths younger than 16 years of age. Adults may not possess a firearm. Youths may possess only one legal firearm while hunting. The supervising adult shall maintain visual and voice contact with the youth at all times, EXCEPT youths 12 years old or older who have successfully completed a hunter safety course may hunt without a supervising adult.

TURKEY TAGGING INFORMATION

Prior to hunting turkey, all turkey hunters, regardless of age or license status, must obtain **either carcass or electronic turkey tags for the current season**. Tags must be in possession when hunting turkey.

PROCESS FOR TAGGING TURKEY

1. Immediately upon harvesting a turkey, the hunter must tag the turkey with the appropriate carcass **or electronic** tag before it is moved from the kill site.
2. The hunter must record the date of kill on the corresponding tag number on the harvest report card portion of the turkey tag license **or report this information electronically**.
3. The hunter must record the date and parish of kill on the carcass tag **or report this information electronically**.
4. The tag must remain attached to the turkey while kept at camp, or while it is transported to the domicile of the hunter or to a cold storage facility. Hunters who keep the carcass or meat at camp must also comply with the resident game possession tag regulations (see *Possession Tags on page 71*).
5. Within **72 hours** the hunter must validate the harvest. Hunters may validate turkey **by utilizing text-to-tag, tagging through the LDWF web portal or by calling the validation toll free number, 225-267-9998 or using the validation website: www.LouisianaOutdoors.com**.

POSSESSION TAGS

Any part of a wild turkey that is divided shall have affixed thereto the name, date, address and LDWF number of the person who harvested the turkey. This information shall be legibly written in pen or pencil on any piece of paper or cardboard or any material which is attached or secured to or enclosing the part or parts. (*Resident Game Possession Tags are provided on page 71 and may be used for such purposes*).

SEX IDENTIFICATION

Positive evidence of sex identification, including the head or intact leg shall remain on any turkey taken, so long as such turkey is kept in camp or field, or is in route to the domicile of its possessor, or until such turkey has been stored at the domicile of its possessor or divided at a cold storage facility and has thus become identifiable as food rather than as wild game.

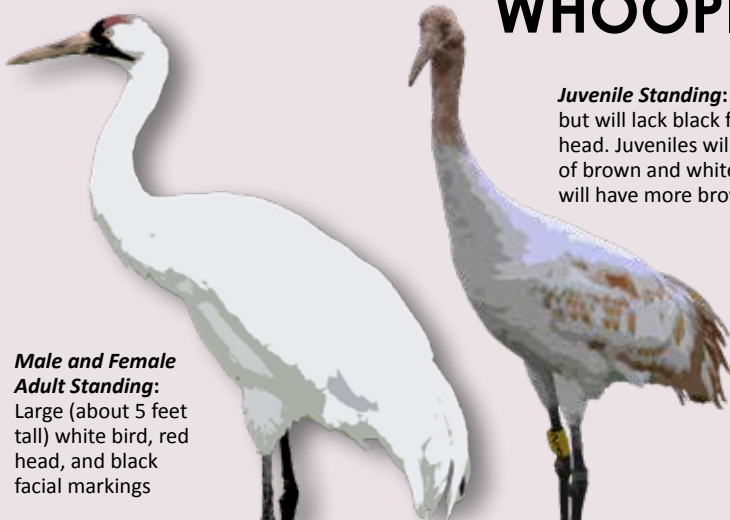
TURKEY TAGGING PROCEDURE FOR LICENSES PURCHASED VIA INTERNET/MOBILE DEVICE

Hunters purchasing licenses online at www.wlf.la.gov/page/hunting-licenses-permits-tags can print an E-License using a personal printer for immediate use, and/or have the option to email or save the licenses purchased to an electronic device which is kept in possession while hunting. **Turkey tags will need to be electronic or printed and in possession while hunting turkey.**

REPLACEMENT OF LOST TAGS

Duplicate tags are available to replace lost tags. Tags can be reprinted online at www.wlf.la.gov/page/hunting-licenses-permits-tags at no cost. If duplicate tags are applied for at the retail location, there is a \$2 charge to the hunter. Hunters that have harvested a turkey tag prior to losing their remaining tags, must remove and discard the duplicate tags to account for the original tags that have been used and validated. Hunters must record these validated tags on the duplicate turkey tag license.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR WHOOPING CRANES



Male and Female Adult Standing: Large (about 5 feet tall) white bird, red head, and black facial markings

Juvenile Standing: Resembles an adult bird but will lack black facial markings and red head. Juveniles will have varying amounts of brown and white feathers, younger birds will have more brown than white.

Male and Female Adult In Flight: Large (wingspan about 7-8 feet) white bird, black wing tips, legs that extend well past the tail and neck is extended during flight.

Juvenile In Flight: Will appear the same as an adult, primarily white body with black wing tips.

WATERFOWL AND GOOSE HUNTING ZONES

West: That portion of the state between the Texas State line and the line going south on LA Hwy 79 from the Arkansas border to Homer; then south on LA 9 to Arcadia; then south on LA 147 to Hodge; then south on US 167 to Lafayette; then south and east on US Hwy 90 to the Mississippi state line.

East: Remainder of state.



DUCKS, COOTS AND MERGANSERS

YOUTH WATERFOWL HUNTING DAYS

Restricted to youths 17 or younger. Youths must be accompanied by one adult 18 years of age or older. Youths must possess a hunter safety certification or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course. If the accompanying adult is in possession of hunter safety certification, a valid hunting license or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course, this requirement is waived for youths younger than 16 years of age. Adults may not possess a firearm. Youths may possess only one legal firearm while hunting. The supervising adult shall maintain visual and voice contact with the youth at all times, regardless of age. Youths may take ducks, geese, mergansers, coots and gallinules on these days. Bag limits are the same as regular duck season. The adult may not hunt ducks on these days.

VETERANS WATERFOWL HUNT DAYS

Restricted to persons who served in the active military, naval, or air service who were discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable, and members of the Armed Forces on active duty including members of the National Guard and Reserves on active duty (other than for training). Veterans and active duty mili-

tary personnel must possess a valid proof of service such as DD214 form, Active Military ID, Retired Military ID, Veterans Administration ID, or Veteran designation on their Driver's License, as well as mandatory waterfowl hunting license(s), HIP certification, and federal duck stamp to participate on these hunt days.

DAILY BAG LIMITS

- **Ducks:** Daily bag limit on ducks is 6 and may include no more than 4 mallards (no more than 2 females), 3 wood ducks, 2 canvasbacks, 2 redheads, 1 mottled duck, 1 black duck and 1 pintail. Only 1 scaup may be taken for the first 15 days of the season with 2 per day allowed for the remainder.
- **Coots:** The daily bag limit for coots is 15.
- **Mergansers:** The daily bag limit for mergansers is 5; only 2 of which may be hooded mergansers. Merganser limits are in addition to the daily bag limit for ducks.

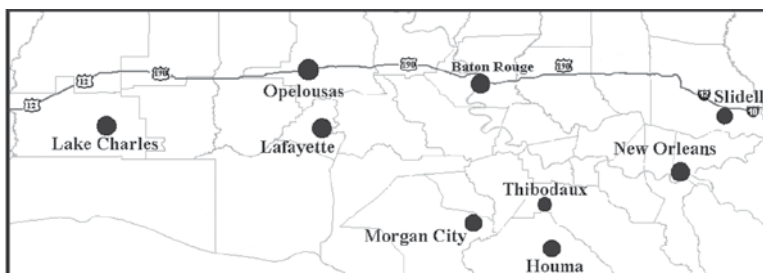
POSSESSION LIMIT

The possession limit on ducks, coots and mergansers is three times the daily bag limit.

DOVE HUNTING

The state shall be divided into **North and South Dove Hunting Zones** by the following boundary: Beginning at the Texas-Louisiana border on LA 12; thence east along LA 12 to its intersection with US 190; thence east along US 190 to its intersection with I-12; thence east along I-12 to its intersection with I-10; thence east along I-10 to the Mississippi state line.

Eurasian collared doves and ringed turtle doves may only be hunted or taken during the open dove season. There is no bag limit on Eurasian collared doves or ringed turtle doves provided that a fully feathered wing and head remain attached to the carcass of the bird. Fully dressed Eurasian collared doves and ringed turtle doves (those without a fully feathered wing and head naturally attached to the carcass) shall be included in the daily bag limit for doves. The bag limit for mourning doves, white-winged doves and fully dressed Eurasian collared and ringed turtle doves is 15 in the aggregate.

CONSERVATION ORDER FOR LIGHT GEESSE

Only snow, blue, and Ross's geese may be taken under the terms of the Conservation Order, which allows the use of electronic calls and unplugged shotguns and eliminates the daily bag and possession limits. During the Conservation Order, shooting hours begins one-half hour before sunrise and extends until one-half hour after sunset.

The Canada Goose season is open statewide **EXCEPT** for a portion of southwest Louisiana:


- **Closed in the following area:** Beginning at the Texas State Line, proceeding east along Hwy 82 to the Calcasieu Ship Channel, then north along the Calcasieu Ship Channel to its junction with the Intracoastal Canal, then east along the Intracoastal Canal to its junction with LA Hwy 82, then south along LA Hwy 82 to its juncture with Parish Road 3147, then south and east along Parish Road 3147 to Freshwater Bayou Canal, then south to the Gulf of Mexico, then west along the shoreline of the Gulf of Mexico to the Texas State Line, then north to the point of beginning at LA Hwy 82. Open waters of Lake Arthur and the Mermentau River, from the Hwy 14 bridge southward, will also be closed to Canada goose hunting.

BAND REPORTING

If you have found or harvested a banded bird, please report it at www.reportband.gov. You'll need the band number as well as where, when, and how you recovered the bird. Your contact information will be requested in case there are any questions. The U.S. Geological Survey's Patuxent Bird Banding Lab (www.usgs.gov/centers/pwrc/science/bird-banding-laboratory) will send you a certificate of appreciation that includes information about the sex, age and species of the bird, and where and when it was banded. You may keep the band. Please note: Even if the band

you recover is inscribed with a 1-800 telephone number, you can only report it at www.reportband.gov.

If some or all of the numbers have worn off, making the band unreadable, please email bandreports@usgs.gov or visit www.usgs.gov/centers/pwrc/science/bird-banding-laboratory for information on how to send the band for chemical etching. Most bands can be chemically etched so that the numbers can be read. The process does not destroy the band, and it will be returned to you. Thank you for helping manage migratory birds.

MIGRATORY BIRDS

SUMMARY OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS

The following is a synopsis of Federal Regulations that pertain to the hunting of migratory game birds. Persons requiring more information should go to www.fws.gov/hunting/whatres.html where they will find a complete version of 50 CFR Part 20. When State law is different from the following Federal law the hunter must comply with the most restrictive law.

RESTRICTIONS

No person shall take migratory game birds:

- with a trap, snare, net, rifle, pistol, swivel gun, shotgun larger than 10-gauge, punt gun, battery gun, machine gun, fishhook, poison, drug, explosive or stupefying substance.
- with a shotgun capable of holding more than three shells, unless it is plugged with a one-piece filler which is incapable of removal without disassembling the gun. This restriction does not apply during the Conservation Order for Light Geese or those selected for the control of resident Canada Geese.
- from a sink box (a low floating device, having a depression affording the hunter a means of concealment beneath the surface of the water).
- from or with the aid of a car or other motor-driven land conveyance or any aircraft, **EXCEPT** that paraplegic and single or double amputees of the legs may take from any stationary motor vehicle or stationary motor-driven land conveyance. "Paraplegic" means an individual afflicted with paralysis of the lower half of the body which involves both legs, usually due to disease of or injury to the spinal cord.
- from or by means of any motor boat or sailboat unless the motor has been completely shut off and/or the sail furled and its progress therefrom has ceased.
- by the use or aid of live birds as decoys; although not limited to, it shall be a violation of this paragraph for any person to take migratory waterfowl on an area where tame or captive live ducks or geese

are present unless such birds are and have been for a period of 10 consecutive days prior to such taking, confined within an enclosure which substantially reduces the audibility of their calls and totally conceals such birds from the sight of wild migratory waterfowl.

- by the aid of baiting, or on or over a baited area where a person knows or reasonably should know that the area is or has been baited. **IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF HUNTERS TO CHECK HIS/HER HUNTING AREA FOR BAIT PRIOR TO EACH HUNT.** A baited area is any area on which salt, grain, or other feed has been placed, exposed, deposited, distributed or scattered, if that salt, grain, or other feed could serve as a lure or attraction for migratory game birds to, on or over areas where hunters are attempting to take them. Any such area will remain a baited area for 10 days following the complete removal of all such salt, grain or other feed. Agricultural areas must be prepared in accordance with official recommendations to be legally hunted. It is a separate offense to place bait on or adjacent to an area that causes, induces or allows another to hunt by the aid of bait or over a baited area. Hunters are responsible for ensuring that an area has not been baited and should verify its legality prior to hunting. The maximum federal penalties are: for hunting over bait; \$15,000/six months jail, and placing bait; \$100,000/one year jail.
- using records or tapes of migratory bird calls or sounds, or electronically amplified imitations of bird calls. This restriction does not apply during the Conservation Order for Light Geese or those selected for the control of resident Canada Geese.
- by driving, rallying or chasing birds with any motorized conveyance or any sailboat to put them in the range of the hunter.

MIGRATORY BIRDS

Birds protected by federal law as a result of treaties signed with other countries. Protected migratory birds are listed in Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations, Section. 10.13. This list includes almost all

SHOOTERS & HUNTERS: HELP PREVENT WILDFIRES.

The target shooting and hunting community prides itself on being safe and responsible with firearms in all situations—from using them outdoors to storing them safely at home. Sometimes, however, unusual conditions such as extremely dry environments require an extra level of awareness and safety on the part of shooters.

Wildfires have many possible causes. The National Shooting Sports Foundation, the trade association for the firearms and ammunition industry, reminds all shooters that during dry and hot weather conditions their use of certain ammunition and targets could accidentally ignite a wildfire. NSSF reminds all target shooters and hunters, as well as other outdoor enthusiasts, to consider the potential consequences of their activities in fire-prone environments.

- **Make it a point to know the regulations and rules related to shooting in areas experiencing dry and hot conditions, whether on public or private land or at shooting ranges. Many national forests, for example, do not allow recreational shooting when fire restrictions are in effect.**
- **Consider the type of ammunition and targets you are using. Minimize the risk of fires by not using steel-jacketed ammunition, ammunition with steel-core components, tracer rounds or exploding targets in fire-prone areas.**
- **Remember that equipment, such as cars and ATVs, can have extremely hot exhaust systems that could ignite dry vegetation, so park only in designated areas.**
- **Extinguish and dispose of smoking materials safely.**
- **Follow guidelines to extinguish campfires.**
- **Warn others of potential dangers and behaviors for starting wildfires.**
- **Report any wildfire you see to authorities.**
- **Spread this message to other target shooters, hunters and outdoor enthusiasts.**

MIGRATORY BIRDS

birds found in the United States with the exception of the house sparrow, feral pigeon (commonly called rock dove), European starling, Eurasian collared-dove, mute swan, and upland game birds (which are protected by state laws).

All migratory birds are protected. However, a subset of migratory birds may be hunted in accordance with state and federal regulations. The list of migratory game birds includes species of ducks, geese (including brant), swans, doves and pigeons, cranes, rails, coots, gallinules and moorhens, woodcock and snipe, if there is an open season.

DAILY BAG LIMIT

The maximum number of migratory game birds of a single species or combination (aggregate) of species permitted to be taken by one person in any one day during the open season in any one specified geographic area for which a daily bag limit is prescribed.

AGGREGATE DAILY BAG LIMIT

The maximum number of migratory game birds permitted to be taken by one person in any one day during the open season when such person hunts in more than one specified geographic area and/or for more than one species for which a combined daily bag limit is prescribed. The aggregate daily bag limit is equal to, but shall not exceed, the largest daily bag limit prescribed for any one species or for any one specified geographic area in which taking occurs.

PERSONAL ABODE

One's principal or ordinary home or dwelling place, as distinguished from one's temporary or transient place of abode or dwelling such as a hunting club, or any club house, cabin, tent or trailer house used as a hunting club, or any hotel, motel or rooming house used during a hunting, pleasure or business trip.

MIGRATORY BIRD PRESERVATION FACILITY

1. Any person who, at their residence or place of business and for hire or other consideration; or
2. Any taxidermist, cold-storage facility or locker plant which, for hire or other consideration; or
3. Any hunting club which, in the normal course of operations; receives, possesses, or has in custody any migratory game birds belonging to another person for purposes of picking, cleaning, freezing, processing, storage or shipment.

NORMAL AGRICULTURAL PLANTING, HARVESTING OR POST-HARVEST MANIPULATION

A planting or harvesting undertaken for the purpose of producing and gathering a crop, or manipulation after such harvest and removal of grain, that is conducted in accordance with official recommendations of State Extension Specialists of the Cooperative Extension Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

NORMAL AGRICULTURAL OPERATION

A normal agricultural planting, harvesting, post-harvest manipulation, or agricultural practice that is conducted in accordance with official recommendations of State Extension Specialists of the Cooperative Extension Service of the USDA.

NORMAL SOIL STABILIZATION PRACTICE

A planting for agricultural soil erosion control or post-mining land reclamation conducted in accordance with official recommendations of State Extension Specialists of the Cooperative Extension Service of the USDA for agricultural soil erosion control.

MANIPULATION

The alteration of natural vegetation or agricultural crops by activities that include but are not limited to mowing, shredding, discing, rolling, chopping, trampling, flattening, burning or herbicide treatments. The term manipulation does not include the distributing or scattering of grain, seed, or other feed after removal from or storage on the field where grown.

NATURAL VEGETATION

Any non-agricultural, native, or naturalized plant species that grows at a site in response to planting or from existing seeds or other propagules. The term natural vegetation does not include planted millet. However, planted millet that grows on its own in subsequent years after the year of planting is considered natural vegetation.

IT IS LEGAL TO TAKE MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS INCLUDING WATERFOWL, COOTS AND CRANES, ON OR OVER THE FOLLOWING LANDS OR AREAS THAT ARE NOT OTHERWISE BAITED AREAS

- Standing crops or flooded standing crops (including aquatics);
- Standing, flooded, or manipulated natural vegetation; flooded harvested croplands; or lands or areas where seeds or grains have been scattered solely as the result of a normal agricultural planting, harvesting, post-harvest manipulation or normal soil stabilization practice;
- From a blind or other place of concealment camouflaged with natural vegetation;
- From a blind or other place of concealment camouflaged with vegetation from agricultural crops, as long as such camouflaging does not result in the exposing, depositing, distributing or scattering of grain or other feed; or
- Standing or flooded standing agricultural crops where grain is inadvertently scattered solely as a result of a hunter entering or exiting a hunting area, placing decoys, or retrieving downed birds.

It is legal to take migratory game birds, EXCEPT waterfowl, coots and cranes, on or over lands or areas that are not otherwise baited

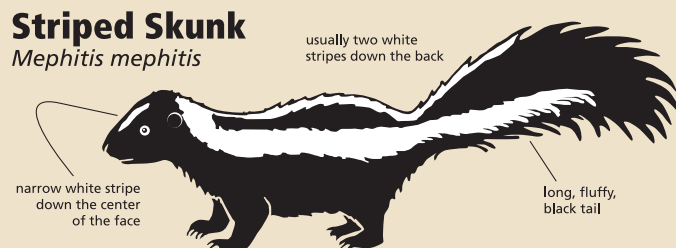

areas, and where grain or other feed has been distributed or scattered solely as the result of manipulation of an agricultural crop or other feed on the land where grown, or solely as the result of a normal agricultural operation.

WANTON WASTE OF MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS

No person shall kill or cripple any migratory game bird without making a reasonable effort to retrieve the bird, and retain it in his actual custody, at the place where taken or between that place and either (a) his automobile or principal means of land transportation; or (b) his personal abode or temporary or transient place of lodging; or (c) a migratory bird preservation facility; or (d) a post office; or (e) a common carrier facility.

OPENING DAY OF A SEASON

No person on the opening day of the season shall possess any freshly killed migratory game birds in excess of the daily bag limit, or aggregate daily bag limit, whichever applies.

CUSTODY OF BIRDS OF ANOTHER

No person shall receive or have in custody any migratory game birds belonging to another person unless such birds are properly tagged.

TERMINATION OF POSSESSION

Subject to all other requirements of this part, the possession of birds taken by any hunter shall be deemed to have ceased when such birds have been delivered by him to another person as a gift; or have been delivered by him to a post office, a common carrier, or a migratory bird preservation facility and consigned for transport by the Postal Service or a common carrier to some person other than the hunter.

GIFT OF MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS

No person may receive, possess or give to another, any freshly killed migratory game birds as a gift, except at the personal abodes of the donor or donee, unless such birds have a tag attached, signed by the hunter who took the birds, stating such hunter's address, the total number and species of birds and the date such birds were taken.

FIELD POSSESSION LIMIT

No person shall possess, have in custody, or transport more than the daily bag limit or aggregate daily bag limit, whichever applies, of migratory game birds, tagged or not tagged, at or between the place where taken and either (a) his automobile or principal means of land transportation; or (b) his personal abode or temporary or transient place of lodging; or (c) a migratory bird preservation facility; or (d) a post office; or (e) a common carrier facility.

TAGGING

No person shall give, put or leave any migratory game birds at any place or in the custody of another person unless the birds are tagged by the hunter with the following information:

1. The hunter's name and signature.
2. The hunter's address.
3. The total number of birds involved, by species.
4. The dates such birds were killed.

Tagging is required if the birds are being transported by another person for the hunter or if the birds have been left for cleaning, storage (including temporary storage), shipment or taxidermy services. (*Migratory Bird Possession Tags are provided on page 71 and may be used for such purposes.*)

POSSESSION OF LIVE BIRDS

Wounded birds reduced to possession shall be immediately killed and included in the daily bag limit.

FIELD DRESSING

No person shall completely field dress any migratory game bird (**EXCEPT** mourning doves, white-winged doves and band-tailed pigeons) and then transport the bird from the field. The head or one fully-feathered wing must remain attached to all such birds while being transported from the field to one's home or to a migratory bird preservation facility.

NONTOXIC SHOT REGULATIONS & ZONE DESCRIPTIONS

No person shall take migratory game birds while possessing shot other than steel or other approved shot. This restriction applies only to ducks, geese, brant, swans and coots.

SHIPMENT

No person shall ship migratory game birds unless the package is marked on the outside with:

- the name and address of the person sending the birds,
- the name and address of the person to whom the birds are being sent and
- the number of birds, by species, contained in the package.

IMPORTATION

For information regarding the importation of migratory birds killed in another country, hunters should consult 50 CFR 20.61 through 20.66. One fully-feathered wing must remain attached to all migratory game birds being transported between a port of entry and one's home or to a migratory bird preservation facility. No person shall import migratory game birds killed in a foreign country, **EXCEPT** Canada, unless such birds are dressed (**EXCEPT** as required in 20.63), drawn and the head and feet are removed. No person shall import migratory game birds belonging to another person.

LICENSE, PERMIT & STAMP REQUIREMENTS

All persons hunting migratory birds must have a valid basic hunting license or equivalent combination license. In addition:

- Persons required to be licensed to hunt migratory birds must have a Harvest Information Program (HIP) certification and must possess proof of HIP certification while hunting. Migratory birds include mourning and white-winged doves, snipe, woodcock, rails, gallinules, ducks, geese and coots. **If you are 17 and under you do not need a HIP certification. You must get HIP certified in every state you hunt migratory birds.** The HIP certification can be obtained online at www.wlf.la.gov/page/hunting-licenses-permits-tags or at LDWF Baton Rouge headquarters.
- Persons 16 years of age and older who hunt ducks and geese must have a Migratory Bird Hunting Conservation Stamp (Federal Duck Stamp), that is signed in ink across the face, on their person while hunting.
- **Persons 18 years and older hunting ducks, geese and coots must have a basic and state waterfowl license or an equivalent combination licenses that grants those privileges and must have the license(s) in their possession when hunting. (see page 6 for license details)**
- The Federal Electronic Duck Stamp allows customers to buy Federal Duck Stamps online for immediate use. The electronic stamp is valid for 45 days from the date of purchase. Customers should receive their physical stamp within this period. As soon as you receive your physical stamp, you must sign it and use it for hunting. If you have not received your Federal Duck Stamp, please contact Amplex at 1-800-852-4897 or duckstamp@amplex.com.

DUAL VIOLATION

Violation of state migratory bird regulations is also a violation of federal regulations.

REFERENCE

FALCONRY

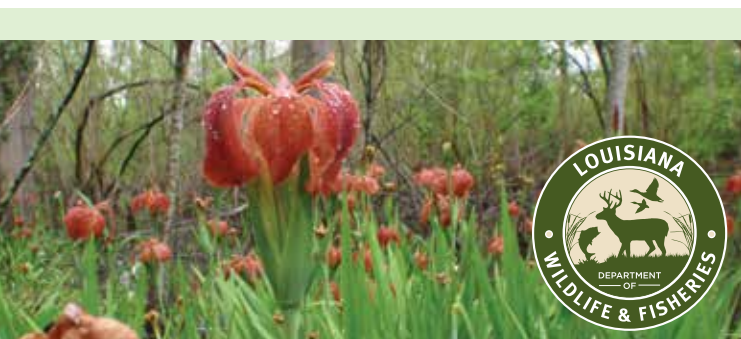
Special permit required. Resident and migratory game species, **EXCEPT** turkey, may be taken. Seasons and bag limits for statewide and WMA regulations apply. Migratory game birds may be taken during regular hunting seasons or during extended falconry seasons. The falconry daily bag limit for migratory game birds during extended falconry seasons and during regular hunting seasons is three migratory game birds, singly or in the aggregate. Possession limit is nine migratory game birds, singly or in aggregate. See LAC 76:V.301 for complete regulations.

LICENSED HUNTING PRESERVE

Oct. 1 - April 30. Pen-raised birds only. No limit entire season. See LAC 76:V.305 for complete regulations.

FARM RAISED WHITE-TAILED DEER & EXOTICS ON SUPPLEMENTED SHOOTING PRESERVES

See LAC 76:XIX.111 for complete regulations. Archery, Firearm & Primitive Firearms: Oct. 1- Jan. 31 (either-sex).



LOUISIANA NATURAL AREAS REGISTRY PROGRAM

The Louisiana Natural Areas Registry Program was created by the Legislature in 1987 and is administered by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF). The program is designed to honor and recognize owners of outstanding natural areas for their commitment to the protection of our state's natural heritage. The program relies on citizen-based conservation and the willingness of landowners to safeguard the best that remains of our natural world. By seeking the cooperation of landowners, the Registry Program encourages voluntary conservation of biologically unique lands and reduces the risk of significant natural areas being inadvertently destroyed.

2022-2023 WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA (WMA) REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations concerning the management, protection and harvest of wildlife have been officially approved and adopted by the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission in accordance with the authority provided in Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, Section 109 of Title 56. Failure to comply with these regulations will subject the individual to citation and/or expulsion from the management area.

- **Persons using WMAs must possess a WMA Access Permit.**
- Users are cautioned that by entering a WMA managed by LDWF, they may be subjecting themselves and/or their vehicles to game and/or license checks, inspections and searches.
- WMA seasons may be altered or closed anytime by LDWF's Secretary in emergency situations (floods, fire or other critical circumstances).
- Hunters may enter the WMA no earlier than 4 a.m. unless otherwise specified. Hunters must check out daily and exit the WMA no later than two hours after sunset, or as otherwise specified. Reference individual WMA listings for specific requirements.
- All privately owned property which is completely surrounded by a wildlife management area shall be subject to all state hunting and fishing provisions, including those provisions regarding seasons. Such private property shall not be subject to the special hunting and fishing provisions which govern the wildlife management area, except that deer may not be taken with the aid of dogs. However, the owner or lessee of such property shall be required to participate in the deer management assistance program provided for in R.S. 56:110. In addition, the owner or lessee of such property shall not be allowed to hunt, trap or take resident game by the aid of baiting or placing bait intended to attract or entice the resident game to the area where hunters are attempting to take them.
- Dumping garbage or trash on WMAs is prohibited. Garbage and trash may be properly disposed of in designated locations if provided.
- Use of drones or unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV) on WMAs is prohibited.
- Disorderly conduct or hunting under the influence of alcoholic beverages, chemicals and other similar substances is prohibited.
- Damage to or removal of trees, shrubs, hard mast (including but not limited to acorns and pecans), wild plants and non-game wildlife (including reptiles and amphibians) or any species of butterflies, skippers or moths is prohibited without a permit from LDWF.
- Burning of the marsh is prohibited. Hunting actively burning marsh is prohibited.
- Gathering and/or removal of soft fruits, mushrooms, berries and American lotus seeds and pods shall be limited to five gallons per person per day.
- Nature Trails: Trails shall be limited to pedestrians only. No vehicles, ATVs/UTVs, horses, mules, bicycles, etc. allowed. Removal of vegetation (standing or down) or other natural material is prohibited.
- Deer seasons are for legal antlered deer unless otherwise specified.
- Small game, when listed under the WMA regulations, may include both resident game animals and game birds as well as migratory birds.
- Oysters may not be harvested from any WMA, **EXCEPT** that oysters may be harvested from private oyster leases and State Seed Grounds located within a WMA, when authorized by the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission and upon approval by the Department of Health.
- Unauthorized entry or unauthorized hunting in restricted areas, refuges or limited access areas, is prohibited unless otherwise specified.
- Operating, modifying, tampering with or altering water control structures is prohibited.
- For your safety ALL oil and gas production facilities (wells, pumping stations and storage facilities) are restricted. Access is prohibited.

PERMITS

WMA ACCESS PERMIT

A WMA Access Permit shall be required for use of LDWF-administered lands including wildlife refuges, wildlife management areas (WMAs) and wildlife conservation areas (WCAs).

- Persons 17 years of age and under are exempt from this requirement.
- A WMA Access Permit is not required for motorists/boaters traveling through the WMA provided that the most direct route is taken and no activities or stops take place.
- The WMA Access Permit is included in the Lifetime, Louisiana Sportsman's and Senior Hunt/Fish licenses.

SELF-CLEARING PERMITS

A Self-Clearing Permit is required for ALL ACTIVITIES on WMAs. Please see page 72 for information about the Self-Clearing App.

The Self-Clearing Permit consists of two portions: Check In and Check Out.

- All persons must obtain a WMA Self-Clearing Permit from a Self-Clearing Permit Station or check in/out electronically through the LDWF Self-Clearing Permit app/Internet Web portal. If checking in through a Self-Clearing Permit Station **check-in** portion **must** be completed and put in a permit box **before** each day's activity on the day of the activity. Users may check in one day in advance of use.
- The **check-out** portion must be carried by each person while on the WMA and **must** be completed and put in a permit box immediately upon exiting the WMA
- Self-Clearing Permits are not required of fishers and boaters who enter a WMA via watercraft from outside the WMA, provided they do not get out of the watercraft and onto WMA property.
- Self-Clearing Permits are not required for motorists/boaters traveling through the WMA provided that the most direct route is taken and no activities or stops take place.

PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED WHEELCHAIR CONFINED DEER AND WATERFOWL HUNTING AREAS

Special deer and waterfowl hunting areas, blinds and stands identified with LDWF logos, have been established for Physically Challenged Hunter Permit (PCHP) wheelchair confined hunters on WMAs. Hunters must obtain PCHP permits and are required to make reservations to use blinds and stands. PCHP wheelchair hunting areas are available on Alexander State Forest, Bayou Pierre, Big Colewa Bayou, Buckhorn, Clear Creek, Floy Ward McElroy, Fort Polk-Vernon, Maurepas Swamp, Sherburne and **West Bay** WMAs. Check WMA hunting schedules or call LDWF Field Offices for additional information.

YOUTH SEASONS AND YOUTH LOTTERY HUNTS

NOTE: Some of the below hunts may be by pre-application lottery. For details, see individual WMA schedules, contact any Field Office, or visit our website at www.wlf.louisiana.gov.

For open, non-lottery youth hunts, only youths 17 or younger may hunt, **EXCEPT** on Sandy Hollow WMA Youth Dove Hunt (see specific WMA Schedule for details). All other seasons are closed **EXCEPT** physically challenged seasons. Youths must be accompanied by one adult 18 years of age or older. Youths must possess a hunter safety certification or proof of successful completion of a hunter safety course. If the accompanying adult has proof of successful completion of a hunter education course or was born before Sept. 1, 1969 and has a valid hunting license, this requirement is waived for youths younger than 16 years of age. **Additionally, any youth participating in the hunt shall have in their immediate possession a Youth License.** Adults may not possess a firearm. Youths may possess only one firearm while hunting. The supervising adult shall maintain visual and voice contact with the youth at all times. **EXCEPT** properly licensed youths 16-17 years old and youths 12 years old or older who have successfully completed a hunter safety course may hunt without a supervising adult.

Self-clearing permits are required on all youth hunts that are open, non-lottery hunts.

DEER:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details. Youth deer seasons are offered on the following WMAs (reference individual WMA listings for dates): Atchafalaya Delta, Attakapas, Bayou Macon, Big Lake, Bodcau, Boeuf, Buckhorn, Clear Creek, Camp Beauregard, Dewey W. Wills, Grassy Lake, J.C. Sonny Gilbert, Joyce, Maurepas Swamp, Pass-a-Loutre, Pearl River, Pomme de Terre, Richard K. Yancey, Russell Sage, Sabine, Sabine Island, Salvador/Timken, Sandy Hollow, Sherburne, Spring Bayou, Tangipahoa Parish School Board, Thistlethwaite, Tunica Hills and West Bay.

Youth lottery hunts are offered on the following WMAs (reference Individual WMA listing for dates): Buckhorn, Dewey W. Wills, Floy Ward McElroy, Pointe-Aux-Chenes, Richard K. Yancey, and Sherburne WMAs. Online lottery applications must be returned no later than Aug. 31 for all pre-application lottery deer hunts.

SQUIRREL:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details. Youth squirrel seasons are offered on Bodcau, Boeuf, Clear Creek, Grassy Lake, Little River, Maurepas Swamp, Pearl River, Pomme de Terre, Russell Sage, Sandy Hollow, Sherburne, Spring Bayou and West Bay WMAs on Sept. 24-25.

MOURNING DOVE:

Loggy Bayou WMAs will have an open youth dove hunt the first Saturday of the Mourning Dove Season. Sandy Hollow WMA will have a youth dove hunt the first Saturday of the Mourning Dove Season. See Sandy Hollow WMA regulations for details.

TURKEY:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details. Youth turkey seasons are offered on the following WMAs (reference individual WMA listings for dates): Big Lake, Bodcau and J.C. Sonny Gilbert.

Youth lottery hunts will be offered on the following WMAs (reference individual WMA listings for dates and status of hunt as a lottery or open, non-lottery hunt): Clear Creek, Fort Polk-Vernon, Pearl River, Peason Ridge, Pomme de Terre, Richard K. Yancey, Sherburne, Spring Bayou, Tunica Hills, and West Bay. Online lottery applications must be returned no later than Feb. 8 for all pre-application lottery turkey hunts.

WMAs with youth lottery hunts are closed to all activities **EXCEPT** turkey hunting by authorized youth hunt participants, shooting range use, and fishing on the day(s) of the youth hunt. Only one turkey is allowed to be taken during lottery hunts.

WATERFOWL:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details. Youth waterfowl seasons are offered the same weekend as the state youth waterfowl hunts on all WMAs unless otherwise noted (reference individual WMA listings for details).

Youth lottery hunts are offered on the following WMAs (reference Individual WMA listing for dates): Bayou Pierre and Sherburne WMAs. Online lottery applications must be returned no later than Sept. 30 for all pre-application lottery waterfowl hunts.

PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED SEASONS AND PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED LOTTERY HUNTS

NOTE: Some of the below hunts may be by pre-application lottery. For details, see individual WMA schedules, contact any Field Office, or visit our website at www.wlf.louisiana.gov.

Only hunters possessing a Physically Challenged Hunters Permit (PCHP) may hunt. Further restrictions may apply.

DEER:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details, permit application, or maps of hunting areas. Either-sex deer may be taken on the following WMAs (reference individual WMA listings for dates and status of hunt as a lottery, pre-application, or open non-lottery hunt): Alexander State Forest, Big Colewa Bayou, Buckhorn, Dewey W. Wills, Floy Ward McElroy, Richard K. Yancey, Sandy Hollow, Sherburne and West Bay. Contact Field Offices for permit application and map of specific hunting area.

DISABLED VETERANS LOTTERY HUNTS

Hunts restricted to those persons selected by lottery. Only U.S. Veterans with proof of service connected disability may apply.

WATERFOWL:

Sherburne WMA only (reference individual WMA listings for dates). Hunt restricted to those persons selected by lottery. Contact the Lafayette Field Office for application and details. Online lottery applications must be returned no later than Sept. 30.

GENERAL LOTTERY HUNTS

WATERFOWL:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details. General Waterfowl Lottery hunts are offered on the following WMAs (reference individual WMA listings for dates): Bayou Pierre and Sherburne. Visit www.wlf.la.gov/page/lottery-hunts to apply online.

TURKEY:

Select WMAs only. Contact the appropriate field office for details. General Turkey Lottery hunts are offered on the following WMAs (reference individual WMA listings for dates): Bayou Macon, Clear Creek, J.C. Sonny Gilbert, Pearl River, Sabine, Sherburne, Tunica Hills and West Bay WMAs. Visit www.wlf.la.gov/page/lottery-hunts to apply online. Only one turkey per hunter is allowed to be taken during lottery hunts.

DOVE:

Elbow Slough only (reference individual WMA listings for dates). Hunting by pre-application lottery only. Visit www.wlf.la.gov/page/lottery-hunts to apply online.

TRAPPING

Consult 2022 trapping regulations for specific dates and regulations. All traps must be run daily. Traps with teeth are illegal.

RACCOON HUNTING

A licensed hunter may take raccoon or opossum, two per person per day, during daylight hours only, during the open hunting season on WMAs.

Nighttime experimental raccoon hunting: All nighttime raccoon hunting, where allowed, is with dogs only.

SMALL GAME EMPHASIS AREAS

Specially designated areas on certain WMAs will allow small game hunting with dogs, confined to that specific area when the remainder of the WMA is restricted to still hunt only. Additionally, off sea-

son training of rabbit and bird dogs may be allowed on some of the Small Game Emphasis Areas. Small Game Emphasis Areas are offered on Big Colewa Bayou, Bayou Macon, Bayou Pierre, Boeuf, Dewey W. Wills, Marsh Bayou, Pomme de Terre, Richard K. Yancey, Russell Sage, Sandy Hollow, Sherburne, Tunica Hills and Walnut Hill WMAs. See individual WMA schedules for details.

BIRD DOG TRAINING AREA

Bird Dog Training Area (BDTA) Rules and Regulations Summary
Bird dog training areas (BDTA) are established on select wildlife management areas (WMA) to afford users an opportunity to train recognized breeds of pointing dogs, spaniels, and retrievers with live released birds. All dogs must wear a collar or tag imprinted with the name and phone number of the owner or trainer. The BDTA is not intended to serve as a hunting preserve. BDTA boundaries are indicated on WMA maps and marked with signs and/or paint.

General Rules:

- Each person using the BDTA for dog training must have a valid self-clearing permit in his/her possession while engaged in dog training on the BDTA. Said permit must indicate the number and species of birds released for training purposes in the comments section.
- Only bobwhite quail, mallards or pigeons may be released within the boundaries of the BDTA for dog training activities (use of pigeons and mallards may be prohibited on specific BDTAs). When WMA/public land hunting seasons are closed, only bobwhite quail, mallards and pigeons may be taken and possessed.
- No more than 6 quail or mallards per day may be released, taken, or possessed per permittee. Wild quail may be taken on the BDTA at any time the BDTA is open to dog training and must be included in the 6-bird limit. There is no limit on the number of pigeons that may be taken, released, or possessed. All mallards must be toe-clipped, or fitted with a seamless band, or otherwise marked

in accordance with federal regulations. Pigeons are not required to be banded. Persons in possession of live bobwhite quail or mallards must have a valid game breeders license or bill of sale from a licensed game breeder.

- When the WMA/public land hunting seasons are closed, only shotguns with shells containing shot not larger than lead size 8 or steel size 6 are permitted on the BDTA. Mallards may only be taken with steel or other approved non-toxic shot. Firearms must be encased or broken down upon entering and leaving the BDTA when the WMA hunting seasons are closed. Pistols capable of firing only blanks are also permitted.
- Persons engaged in dog training on BDTAs during WMA hunting seasons must comply with WMA/public land hunter orange requirements.
- See individual WMA hunting schedule for season/BDTA open dates.

SPORT FISHING

Sport fishing, crawfishing and frogging are allowed on WMAs when in compliance with current laws and regulations **EXCEPT** as otherwise specified under individual WMA listings.

ARCHERY SEASON FOR DEER

The archery season on WMAs is the same as outside **EXCEPT** as otherwise specified on individual WMAs. Either-sex deer may be taken on WMAs at any time during archery season **EXCEPT** when bucks-only seasons are in progress on the respective WMAs. Archers must abide by bucks-only regulations and other restrictions when such seasons are in progress.

PRIMITIVE FIREARMS SEASON FOR DEER

Either-sex unless otherwise specified. Youth 17 or younger may use any legal weapon during the primitive firearms season on WMAs (*Refer to Legal Gear for Primitive Firearms Season on page 23*).

METHODS OF TAKING GAME

- For deer, season limits on WMAs are part of the deer area limit. Daily bag limits are the same as statewide daily bag limits **UNLESS** a Bucks Only Season is in progress on that WMA **EXCEPT** Floy Ward McElroy WMA (reference individual WMA listings for seasons).
- Moving deer or hogs on a WMA with organized drivers and standers, drivers or making use of noises or noise-making devices is prohibited. Deer hunting on WMAs is restricted to still hunting only.
- Baiting, hunting over bait, or possession of bait is prohibited on all WMAs **EXCEPT** bait may be kept in a vehicle traversing a WMA road or parked on a WMA road. Bait is defined as any substance used to attract game via ingestion.
- During Mandatory Deer Check hunts, deer may not be skinned nor have any external body parts removed, including but not limited to feet, legs, tail, head or ears before being checked out.
- When Mandatory Deer Checks are specified on WMAs, hunters must check deer at weigh stations as designated on WMA maps.
- Hunting from utility poles and structures, and oil and gas exploration facilities or platforms is prohibited.
- Tree climbing spurs, spikes or screw-in steps are prohibited.
- Construction of and/or hunting from permanent tree stands or permanent blinds on WMAs is prohibited. Any permanent stand or permanent blind will be removed and destroyed.
 - A permanent blind is any blind using non-natural materials or having a frame which is not dismantled within two hours after the end of legal shooting time each day. Blinds with frames of wood, plastic, metal poles, wire, mesh, webbing or other materials may be used but must be removed from the WMA within two hours after the end of legal shooting time each day. Blinds made solely of natural vegetation and not held together by nails or other metallic fasteners may be left in place but cannot be used to reserve hunting locations. Natural vegetation (including any material used as corner posts) is defined as natural branches that are two inches or less in diameter.
- Permanent tree stands are any stands that use nails, screws, spikes, etc. to attach to trees.
- Deer stands may not be left on WMAs unless the stands are:
 - Removed from trees.
 - Placed flat on the ground.
 - Left in a non-hunting position (a non-hunting position is one in which a hunter could not hunt from the stand in its present position).
 - Legibly tagged with the user's name, address, phone number and LDWF ID number.
 - All portable stands, blinds, tripods, etc. found unattended in a hunting position, not placed flat on the ground, or untagged will be confiscated and disposed of by LDWF.
- No stand may be left on any WMA prior to the day before deer season opens on that WMA and all stands must be removed from the WMA within one day after the close of deer hunting on that WMA.
- Free standing blinds must be disassembled when not in use.
- Unattended decoys prohibited. Decoys left unattended will be confiscated, forfeited to and disposed of by LDWF.
- Spot-lighting (shining) from vehicles is prohibited.
- Horses and mules may be ridden on WMAs **EXCEPT** where prohibited and **EXCEPT** during firearms seasons for deer and turkey. Riding is restricted to designated roads and trails depicted on WMA map. Organized Trail Rides prohibited, **EXCEPT** allowed by permit only on Camp Beauregard WMA (contact Pineville Field Office for details). Hunting and trapping from horses and mules is prohibited **EXCEPT** for quail hunting or as otherwise specified. Horse-drawn conveyances are prohibited.

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS

HUNTER ORANGE AND BLAZE PINK

- All hunters (including archers and small game hunters) and trappers, **EXCEPT** waterfowl hunters and mourning dove hunters on WMAs must display 400 square inches of “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” and wear a “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” hat or cap during open firearms seasons for deer.
- Quail and woodcock hunters and hunters participating in special dog seasons for rabbit, squirrel and feral hogs are required to wear a minimum of a “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” hat or cap.
- All other hunters and archers (while on the ground), **EXCEPT** waterfowl hunters, also must wear a minimum of a “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” hat or cap during special dog seasons for rabbit and squirrel.
- Hunters participating in special shotgun season for feral hogs on Atchafalaya Delta, Pass-a-Loutre, Pointe-aux-Chenes and Salvador WMAs must display 400 square inches of “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” and wear a “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” cap.
- Deer hunters hunting from concealed blinds must display a minimum of 400 square inches of “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink” above or around their blinds which is visible from 360 degrees.

ALSO, all persons afield during hunting seasons are encouraged to display “Hunter Orange” or “Blaze Pink.”

FIREARMS

- Firearms having live ammunition in the chamber, magazine, cylinder or clip when attached to firearms or crossbows cocked and in the ready position are not allowed in or on vehicles, boats under power, motorcycles, ATVs/UTVs, ATCs or in camping areas on WMAs.
- Firearms may not be carried on any area before or after permitted hours **EXCEPT** in authorized camping areas or as otherwise specified and **EXCEPT** as may be permitted for authorized trappers (see *Quadrupeds* page 25).
- Firearms and bows and arrows are not allowed on WMAs during closed seasons **EXCEPT** on designated shooting ranges or as permitted for trapping, and **EXCEPT** as allowed pursuant to R.S. 56:109.C and R.S. 56:1691. Bows and broadhead arrows are not allowed on WMAs **EXCEPT** during deer archery season, turkey season or as permitted for bowfishing. Active and retired law enforcement officers in compliance with POST requirements, Federal Law Enforcement Officers and holders of Louisiana concealed handgun permits or permit holders from a reciprocal state, who are in compliance with all other state and federal firearms regulations, may possess firearms on WMAs, provided these firearms are not used for any hunting purpose.
- Encased or broken down firearms and any game harvested may be transported through the areas by the most direct route provided that no other route exists **EXCEPT** as specified under WMA listing.
- Loaded firearms are not allowed near WMA check stations.
- The following cannot be carried onto any WMA **EXCEPT** during modern and primitive firearm deer seasons and during special shotgun season for feral hogs on Atchafalaya Delta, Pass-a-Loutre, Pointe-aux-Chenes and Salvador WMAs (see individual WMA season schedules for specific regulations).
 - Centerfire rifles
 - Break-action centerfire and Bolt-action centerfire handguns
 - Scoped centerfire handguns
 - Shotgun slugs or shot larger than BB lead or F steel
- Target shooting and other forms of practice shooting are prohibited on WMAs **EXCEPT** as otherwise specified.
- Discharging of firearms on or across, or hunting from designated roads, ATV/UTV trails, nature trails, hiking trails, and their rights-of-way is prohibited during open firearms seasons for deer.

CAMPING

- A WMA Camping Permit is required for each camping party utilizing a LDWF-operated campground on a WMA. A camping party is defined as one to five individuals 18 or older. If any camping group is over five individuals 18 or older, then multiple WMA Camping Permits are required. Youths 17 and younger are exempt from the WMA Camping Permit requirement. The WMA Camping Permit(s) or camping permit number shall be displayed at each camping party's campsite. A campsite is defined as any tent, RV, camper, vehicle or site occupied within a campground or vessel/houseboat moored adjacent to a campground.
- Camping on WMAs, including trailers, houseboats, vessels, recreational vehicles and tents, is allowed only in designated areas and for a period not to exceed 16 (**EXCEPT** Bodcau WMA is not to exceed 14 days during a 30-day period) consecutive days, regardless of whether the camp is attended or unattended. At the end of the 16-day period camps must be removed from the area for at least 48 hours. Camping area use limited exclusively to outdoor recreational activities. Camping on WMAs is available on a first-come, first-serve basis unless otherwise specified.
- Houseboats and vessels utilized for recreational activities are prohibited from overnight mooring within WMAs **EXCEPT** on stream banks adjacent to designated camping areas. Overnight mooring of vessels that provide lodging for hire are prohibited on WMAs. Houseboats and vessels shall not impede navigation. No refuse or garbage may be dumped from these boats. Houseboat mooring on Atchafalaya Delta WMA is allowed via permit only, in designated areas, during hunting season. Permits for Atchafalaya Delta WMA are available via annual lottery or by a five-year bid lease program. Contact the Lafayette Field Office for details.
- Discharge of human waste onto lands or waters of any WMA is prohibited. In the event public restroom facilities are not available at a WMA, the following is required: anyone camping on a WMA in a camper, trailer or other unit (other than a houseboat or tent) shall have and shall utilize an operational disposal system attached to the unit; tent campers shall have and shall utilize portable waste disposal units and shall remove all human waste from the WMA upon leaving; houseboats moored on a WMA shall have a permit or letter of certification from the Health Unit (Department of Health and Hospitals) of the parish within which the WMA occurs verifying that it has an approved sewerage disposal system on board. Further, that system shall be utilized by occupants of the houseboats when on the WMA.
- Firearms may not be kept loaded or discharged in a camping area unless otherwise specified.
- Campsites must be cleaned by occupants prior to leaving and all refuse placed in designated locations when provided or carried off by campers.
- Trash must be contained at all times while camping.
- Burning of trash is prohibited.
- Glass containers and bottles prohibited on campgrounds.
- Swimming is prohibited within 100 yards of boat launching ramps.

COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES

EXCEPT for licensed activities otherwise allowed by law, commercial activities are prohibited without a permit issued by the Secretary of LDWF.

COMMERCIAL FISHING

- Commercial fishing is prohibited year-round on the following WMAs: Salvador/Timken, Pointe-aux-Chenes WMAs, **EXCEPT** commercial fishing on Pointe-aux-Chenes is allowed in Cutoff Canal.
- Commercial fishing is prohibited during open waterfowl seasons on the Grand Bay, Silver Lake and Lower Sunk Lake on Richard K. Yancey WMA.
- Permits are required of all commercial fisherman using the following WMAs: Grassy Lake, Pomme de Terre and Spring Bayou WMAs. Non-compliance with permit regulations will result in revocation of commercial fishing privileges for the period the license is issued and one year thereafter.

VEHICLES

ATV (definition): An All-Terrain Vehicle is a wheeled or tracked off-road vehicle (not legal for highway use) not to exceed the following: weight - 750 lbs; length - 85 inches; width - 48 inches. ATV tires are restricted to those no larger than 26 x 12 with a maximum 1-inch lug height and a maximum allowable tire pressure of 12 psi as indicated on the tire by the manufacturer. Use of all other ATVs or ATV tires are prohibited on a WMA.

UTV (definition): A Utility Type Vehicle (or Utility Terrain Vehicle) is any recreational motor vehicle other than an ATV, wheeled or tracked, not legal for highway use, designed for and capable of travel over designated unpaved roads, traveling on four or more low-pressure tires not to exceed the following: weight - 1900 lbs; length - 128 inches; width - 68 inches. UTV tires are restricted to those no larger than 27 x 12 with a maximum 1-inch lug height and a maximum allowable tire pressure of 12 psi. UTVs are commonly referred to as "side-by-sides" and may include golf carts.

Personal Water Craft (definition): A vessel which uses an inboard motor powering a water jet pump as its primary source of propulsion and is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing or kneeling on the vessel rather than in the conventional manner of sitting or standing inside the vessel.

ATV AND ATV/UTV TRAILS SIGNAGE AND MARKING

All trails will be marked with signage and the following:

- Entrances to ATV trails will be marked with peach colored paint.
- Entrances to ATV/UTV trails will be marked with orange colored paint.
- Entrances to Physically Challenged Only trails will be marked with blue colored paint.
- Entrances to ATV trails that are open year-round will be marked with purple paint.
- The end of all trails will be marked with red paint.

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED ON WMAS

- Vehicles having wheels with a wheel-tire combination radius of 17 inches or more (measured from the center of the hub and horizontal to ground).
- The testing, racing, speeding or unusual maneuvering of any type of vehicle.
- Tractor or implement tires with farm tread designs R1, R2 and R4 known commonly as spade or lug grip types.
- Use of airboats, aircraft, personal water craft, "mud crawling vessels" (commonly referred to as crawfish combines which use paddle wheels for locomotion) and hover craft, and **EXCEPT** type A personal water craft, model year 2003 and beyond, which are eight feet in length and greater, may be operated within WMAs from April 1 until the Monday of Labor Day weekend, from sunrise to sunset only, and **EXCEPT** personal water craft are allowed on designated portions of Alexander State Forest WMA year-around. No person shall operate such watercraft at a speed greater than "slow/no wake" within 100 feet of an anchored or moored vessel, shoreline, dock, pier or persons engaged in angling or any other manually powered vessel.

- Drag seines (**EXCEPT** minnow and bait seines) are prohibited **EXCEPT** experimental bait seines allowed on Dewey Wills WMA north of LA 28 in diversion canal.
- No commercial fishing activity shall impede navigation and no unattended vessels or barges will be allowed.
- Commercial fishing is allowed on Pass-a-Loutre and Atchafalaya Delta WMAs. See Pass-a-Loutre for additional commercial fishing regulations on mullet.

HUNTING GUIDES/OUTFITTERS

No person or group of persons may act as a hunting guide, outfitter or in any other capacity for which they are paid or promised to be paid directly or indirectly by any other individual or individuals for services rendered to any other person or persons hunting on any WMA, regardless of whether such payment is for guiding, outfitting, lodging or club memberships.

- Driving or parking vehicles on food or cover plots and strips.
- Blocking the entrance to roads and trails.
- Operation of licensed motorized vehicles (LMVs) legal for highway use, including motorcycles, off of designated roads as indicated on WMA maps.
- Operation of ATVs or UTVs off of designated, marked ATV or ATV/UTV trails, **EXCEPT** that those UTVs in which the manufacturer's specifications do not exceed the weight, length, width, and tire restrictions for ATVs are allowed on ATV trails, and **EXCEPT** when WMA roads are closed to LMVs. ATVs and/or UTVs may then be operated on those roads when allowed. NOTE: Only ATV and UTV trails marked with signs and/or paint, AND depicted on WMA maps are open for use.
- Operation of electric bicycles off of designated roads and ATV/UTV trails as indicated on WMA maps.
- Leaving of ATVs and motorcycles overnight on WMAs, **EXCEPT** on designated camping areas.
- Use of ATVs/UTVs from two hours after sunset to 4 a.m., **EXCEPT** raccoon hunters may use ATVs during nighttime raccoon take seasons only.
- Use of ATVs/UTVs from March 1 - Aug. 31 **EXCEPT** squirrel hunters are allowed to use ATV trails during the spring squirrel season on certain WMAs, and **EXCEPT** certain trails may be open during this time period to provide access for fishing or other purposes, and **EXCEPT** allowed on Year-Round ATV/UTV Trails.
- Operation of internal combustion powered vessels within designated Limited Access Areas (LAAs) prohibited during the months of September through January. Trolling motors may be used to access and navigate within LAAs. A trolling motor is defined as a self-contained unit that includes a completely submerged electric motor at the end of the shaft, propeller and controls, and is affixed to a vessel, either at the bow or stern. Vehicles prohibited November through January. LAAs are on Atchafalaya Delta, Boeuf, Dewey W. Wills, Joyce, Manchac, Pass-a-Loutre, Pointe-Aux-Chenes and Russell Sage WMAs. See WMA maps for specific locations.
- Operation of vessels beyond bare steerage speed (the slowest speed a vessel can travel while maintaining directional control) in no wake zones.

PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED ATV/UTV PERMITS AND ATV/UTV TRAILS

Use of special ATV/UTV trails for physically challenged persons is restricted to ATV/UTV physically challenged permittees. Physically challenged ATV/UTV permittees are restricted to physically challenged ATV/UTV trails or other ATV/UTV trails only as indicated on WMA maps or as marked by sign and or paint. Persons 60 years of age or older, with proof of age, are also allowed to use physically challenged trails and need not obtain a permit. However, these persons must abide by all rules in place for these trails. Physically challenged persons under the age of 60 must apply for and obtain a Physically Challenged Hunter Program Permit from LDWF.

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS

RETRIEVAL OF GAME WITH ATVS

- Hunters are allowed to retrieve their own downed deer and hogs with the aid of an ATV or electric bicycle, **EXCEPT** on Atchafalaya Delta, Biloxi, Lake Boeuf, Pass-a-Loutre, Pointe-aux-Chenes, Salvador/Timken, Sherburne, and Thistlethwaite WMAs, and the Crusel Tract of Maurepas Swamp WMA and KNF Vernon Unit lands within Fort Polk-Vernon WMA, under the following conditions:
 - No firearms or archery equipment is in possession of the retrieval party or on the ATV or electric bicycle.

- The retrieval party may consist of no more than one ATV or electric bicycle and one helper.
 - ATVs or electric bicycle may not be used to locate or search for wounded game or for any other purpose than retrieval of deer and hogs once they have been legally harvested and located.
- UTVs may not be used to retrieve downed deer or hogs.

NOTE: A maximum 20 mph speed limit is recommended for all land vehicles using WMA roads, unless specific signage otherwise allows or restricts.

DOGS

- All use of dogs on WMAs, **EXCEPT** for bird hunting and duck hunting, is **EXPERIMENTAL** as required by law. Having or using dogs on any WMA is prohibited **EXCEPT** for nighttime experimental raccoon hunting, squirrel hunting, rabbit hunting, bird hunting, duck hunting, hog hunting and bird dog training when allowed (see individual WMA seasons listings for WMAs that allow dogs).
- Dogs running at large are prohibited on WMAs. The owner or handler of said dogs shall be liable.
- Only recognizable breeds of bird dogs and retrievers are allowed for quail and migratory bird hunting. Only beagle hounds which

do not exceed 15 inches at the front shoulders and which have recognizable characteristics of the breed may be used on WMAs having experimental rabbit seasons.

- A leashed dog may be used to retrieve wounded or un-recovered deer during legal hunting hours. Any leashed dog used to trail or retrieve wounded or un-recovered deer shall have on a collar with the owner's name, address and phone number. In addition, a dog may be used to trail and retrieve un-recovered deer after legal hunting hours; however, no person accompanying a dog after legal hunting hours may carry a firearm of any sort.

2022-2023 WMA BASIC SEASON SCHEDULE

SMALL GAME (SQUIRREL, RABBIT, QUAIL, MOURNING DOVE, WOODCOCK, SNIPE, RAIL AND GALLINULE)

- Same as outside unless otherwise specified on certain WMAs (see WMA schedule for details).
- Unless otherwise specified under the specific WMA hunting schedule, the use of dogs for rabbit and squirrel hunting is prohibited.
- Non-toxic shot must be used for snipe, rail and gallinule. Non-toxic shot size 6 and smaller must be used for dove.

FERAL HOGS

Feral hogs may be taken during any legal hunting season on WMAs by properly licensed and/or permitted hunters bearing a license and gear legal for specified seasons in progress, **EXCEPT** take of hogs is prohibited during nighttime raccoon seasons. Hogs may not be taken with the aid of dogs, **EXCEPT** feral hogs may be taken with the aid of dogs during the month of February on Attakapas, Bodcau, Clear Creek, Little River, Pearl River, Sabine, Sabine Island, West Bay, and that portion of Dewey W. Wills north of the Catahoula Lake Diversion Canal by self-clearing permit. During this February dog season, all

hogs must be killed immediately and may not be transported live under any conditions, and hunters may use centerfire handguns in addition to using guns allowed for season in progress. In addition, feral hogs may be taken on Atchafalaya Delta, Pass-a-Loutre, Pointe-aux-Chenes and Salvador/Timken WMAs from Feb. 16 - March 31 with archery gear, shotguns loaded with buckshot or slugs or rimfire rifles no larger than .22 caliber. Additional requirements may be specified under individual WMAs.

WATERFOWL (DUCKS, GEESE AND COOTS)

- Same as outside unless otherwise specified on certain WMAs (see WMA schedule for closures and details).
- Hunting after 2 p.m. is prohibited on all WMAs **EXCEPT** for Atchafalaya Delta, Biloxi and Pass-a-Loutre WMAs. Consult the specific WMA regulations for shooting hours on these WMAs.

OUTLAW QUADRUPEDS (COYOTES, ARMADILLOS & FERAL HOGS) AND BIRDS

Outlaw quadrupeds and birds may be taken during any legal hunting season on WMAs by properly licensed and/or permitted hunters bearing a license and gear legal for specified seasons in progress. See page 26 for seasons and regulations pertaining to crows, blackbirds, grackles and cowbirds.

ACADIANA CONSERVATION CORRIDOR

Owner: LDWF (2,285 acres, Lafayette Office)

No motorized vehicles allowed and no access via I-49 right-of way. Self-Clearing Permits required for all activities.

Deer Archery (bucks only): Oct. 1-15

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 16 - Feb. 15

All other seasons CLOSED.

ALEXANDER STATE FOREST

Owner: LDWF (283 acres, Pineville Office); LDAF (7,875 acres)

From December through February all hunters must check daily with the Office of Forestry for scheduled burning activity. No hunting or other activity will be permitted in burn units the day of the burning. Call 318-487-5172 or 318-487-5058 for information on burning schedules. Self-Clearing Permits required for **all activities**. Vehicles restricted to paved and graveled roads. No parking on or fishing or swimming from bridges. No open fires **EXCEPT** in recreation areas.

Attaching stands to red-cockaded woodpecker cavity trees is prohibited. Cavity trees are marked with painted, double white bands.

Physically Challenged Wheelchair Confined Deer Hunting Area: Access restricted. Check WMA map for location and call Pineville Office for details and applications. Hunting PCHP blind hunting by reservation Class I, III and IV PCHP permittees only. See dates below.

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 1 - Jan. 31

Deer Firearms (either-sex): Nov. 5-6, mandatory deer check.

Deer Firearms (bucks only): Nov. 25-27

Deer Primitive Firearms (either-sex): Oct. 8-9, mandatory deer check.

Physically Challenged Deer Hunting Area (either-sex): Oct. 22-23, Nov. 5-6 & 25-27, and Dec. 10-11 & 17-18

Small Game: Same as outside **EXCEPT CLOSED** Oct. 8-9 and Nov. 5-6 and **OPEN** to squirrel hunting during the spring season, May 6-14, with or without dogs. Beagles allowed for rabbits and dogs allowed for squirrel hunting Dec. 17 - Feb. 28.

Waterfowl: Same as outside **EXCEPT CLOSED** after 2 p.m. (Certain areas may be closed as posted).

ATCHAFALAYA DELTA

Owner: State of Louisiana (137,695 acres, Lafayette Office)

Self-Clearing Permit required for **all activities**. Self-clearing permits available from Main Delta campground, Wax Delta Campground, Cul-de-sac on Big Island, and Berwick Public Boat Launch (Jesse Fontenot Boat Launch) or through the LDWF Self-clearing Permit app or internet/web portal. Camping and houseboat mooring allowed **ONLY** in designated campgrounds. Houseboat mooring allowed by permit only in designated areas, during hunting season (*see page 48 for details*).

ATCHAFALAYA DELTA (cont.)

Vessels/Vehicles: Mudboats or air-cooled propulsion vessels powered by more than 36 total horsepower are prohibited on the WMA. All ATVs/UTVs, motorcycles, horses and mules prohibited **EXCEPT** as permitted for authorized WMA trappers.

Big Island: **EXCEPT** for Youth Deer Hunting (provided for below), all other hunting **CLOSED** from Oct. 1 through the last day of youth deer seasons.

AREA CLOSED: Main Delta area **CLOSED** to all hunters **EXCEPT** for Youth Deer Hunters when youth deer season is open.

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 1 - Jan. 31 on Main Delta only; no deer hunting on Wax Lake Delta.

Deer Youth Shotgun (buckshot only, either-sex) and Archery (either-sex): Oct. 1-2 & 8-9 on Main Delta only; no deer hunting on Wax Lake Delta.

Small Game: Same as outside **EXCEPT Rabbit Only:**

- **Wax Lake Delta:** Oct. 1-31 and Feb. 1-28, with or without beagles. Nov. 1 - Jan. 31 without beagles only.
- **Main Delta:** Feb. 1-28, with or without beagles. **CLOSED** October through January.

Waterfowl: Same as outside, **EXCEPT** shooting hours shall be 1/2 hour before sunrise to 2 p.m. during opening weekends of teal and duck season and 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset the remainder of the season, and **EXCEPT** shooting hours are the same as outside for the Youth Hunt weekend.

Feral Hogs: May be taken by properly licensed hunters Oct. 1 - Feb. 28. In addition, hunters may hunt feral hogs with archery equipment, shotguns loaded with buckshot or slugs or rimfire rifles no larger than .22 caliber from Feb. 16 - March 31.

ATTAKAPAS

Owner: State of Louisiana (25,730 acres); U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (2,232 acres, Lafayette Office)

Self-Clearing Permits required for **all activities**.

AREA CLOSED: Oct. 29-30 to all hunters **EXCEPT** Youth Deer Hunters.

Deer: Deer hunting will be **CLOSED** when the river stage of the Atchafalaya River reaches 15 feet at Butte La Rose, and will reopen when the river stage of the Atchafalaya River recedes to 14 feet at Butte La Rose.

Deer Archery (bucks only): Oct. 1-15

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 16 - Feb. 15

Deer Youth (either-sex): Oct. 29-30

Deer Firearms (either-sex): Nov. 25-26

Deer Firearms (bucks only): Dec. 24 - Jan. 1

Deer Primitive Firearms (bucks only): Jan. 21-22

Turkey: Closed

Small Game and Waterfowl: Same as outside **EXCEPT CLOSED** Oct. 29-30 and Nov. 25-26. Beagles allowed for rabbits and dogs allowed for squirrel hunting Jan. 23 - Feb. 28 and open to squirrel hunting during the spring season, May 6-14, with or without dogs.

Raccoon (nighttime): Sept. 10-25 and Jan. 23 - Feb. 28

AREA CLOSED: Closed to all activities **EXCEPT** youth deer hunters Oct. 29-30

All night activities prohibited **EXCEPT** as otherwise provided.

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 1 - Jan. 31

Deer Youth (either-sex): Oct. 29-30

Deer Firearms (either-sex): Nov. 25-26, mandatory deer check. Nov. 27, self-clearing permit.

Deer Primitive Firearms (either-sex): Dec. 17-25

Turkey General Lottery: April 22-23. Hunting by pre-application lottery only. Visit www.wlf.la.gov/page/lottery-hunts to apply online.

Small Game and Waterfowl: Same as outside **EXCEPT WATERFOWL CLOSED** after 2 p.m. and **EXCEPT CLOSED** Oct. 29-30 and Nov. 25-27. Beagles allowed for rabbits and dogs allowed for squirrel hunting Dec. 26 - Feb. 28 and **OPEN** to squirrel hunting during the spring season, May 6-14, with or without dogs. On that portion designated as Small Game Emphasis Area, beagles are allowed for rabbit and dogs are allowed for squirrel Oct. 16 - Nov. 21, and training of beagles for rabbit and dogs for squirrel allowed June 1 - Aug. 31.

Raccoon (nighttime): Sept. 1-16 and Jan. 7 - Feb. 28

BAYOU PIERRE

Owner: LDWF (2,799 acres, Minden Office)

Waterfowl Refuge is closed to all hunting, trapping and fishing **EXCEPT** for archery hunting for deer, which is allowed on the entire area. Refuge is marked with "Waterfowl Refuge" signs. Contact the Minden Field Office at 318-371-3050 for details on the lottery hunts listed below.

Dove: Same as outside.

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 1 - Jan. 31

Physically Challenged Deer Hunting Area: Nov. 25-27, either-sex. Dec. 10-25, bucks only

Vessels/Vehicles: Type A personal watercraft, model year 2003 and beyond, which are 8 or more feet in length, may be operated on Pointe-aux-Chenes WMA from April 1 until the Monday after Labor Day Weekend, from sunrise to sunset only. 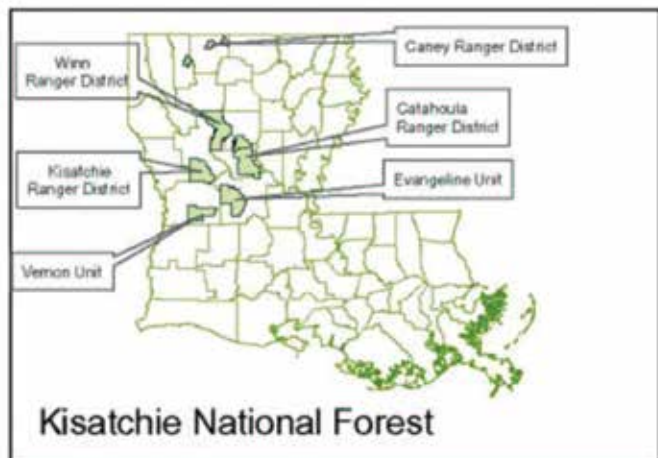

All Seasons for KNF are for 2022-2023 only.

Vehicles:

- Motorized travel off designated roads and trails and outside designated areas is prohibited on the entire KNF. Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM) showing designated roads and trails and associated vehicles and travel seasons are available in all Forest Service offices and on the Kisatchie website: www.fs.usda.gov/kisatchie.
- ATV/UTV (50-inch maximum width) operation is prohibited on public roads and road rights-of-way. Use is allowed on KNF roads designated as open seasonally to ATV/UTV use. Use is prohibited in some campsites and recreation areas; see bulletin boards for additional information (also see MVUM).
- Nighttime ATV/UTV travel is prohibited. ATV/UTV travel is allowed between one hour before sunrise and one hour after sunset.
- Game retrieval with an ATV/UTV is only allowed within designated 300-foot corridors (see MVUM).

Camping:

- Camping corridors for highway-legal vehicles to drive within 100 feet of the road and camp are designated on the Caney District and in the Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserve (see MVUM).
- Contact your local ranger district office for additional information about camping.

Hunter Orange or Blaze Pink: LDWF WMA regulations for Hunter Orange/Blaze Pink apply.

KISATCHIE NATIONAL FOREST (cont.)

General: Hunting or discharging a firearm in or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, across/on a NFSR (National Forest System Road) legally open to motorized use, across a body of water where any person/property is exposed to injury/damage as a result of such discharge, is prohibited.

Firearms (For a full description of USFS regulations, consult the Title 36 of the Code of Federal Regulations):

- **Hunting** or discharging a firearm or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property is prohibited as follows:
 1. In or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, or
 2. Across or on a National Forest System road or a body of water adjacent thereto, or in any manner or place whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result in such discharge.
 3. Hunting within 50 feet of the centerline of any road on KNF lands. It is prohibited to possess a firearm having live ammunition in the chamber, magazine, cylinder or clip (when attached to a firearm), or crossbow cocked and in the ready position in or on any type vehicle while on KNF.
- Active and retired law enforcement officers in compliance with POST requirements, Federal Law Enforcement Officers, holders of Louisiana concealed handgun permits or permit holders from a reciprocal state, who are in compliance with all other state and federal firearms regulations, may possess firearms while on KNF lands, provided these firearms are not used for any hunting purposes.
- The following cannot be carried while hunting on KNF lands except during modern and primitive deer seasons.
 - Centerfire rifles
 - Break-action centerfire and bolt-action centerfire hand guns
 - Scoped centerfire handguns
 - Shotgun slugs or shot larger than BB lead or F steel

Deer Hunting:

- Bag Limit = 1 deer per day up to the statewide seasonal limit.
- All deer hunting is still hunting only.
- All deer must be tagged as required by LDWF regulations.
- Hunting stand, blind, tripod, baiting, spot-lighting etc. regulations applicable to LDWF WMAs are in effect on KNF unless otherwise specified (refer to "Methods of Taking Game" section of the 2022-2023 LDWF WMA Regulations) excluding the "Bag Limit" and "Horses and Mules" sections.
- Hunting from a permanent stand is prohibited. Placing or leaving a temporary stand is limited to 24 hours.
- The training of deer dogs is prohibited year-round.
- See separate schedule for Catahoula and Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserves.
- LDWF Youth Deer Hunt Regulations apply for all KNF lands **EXCEPT** that archery and open seasons for small game hunting is allowed (excluding those portions of the Vernon Unit within Fort Polk-Vernon WMA).

Archery - Deer Hunting:

- **General:** Either-sex deer may be taken at any time by archers during the archery season **EXCEPT** when bucks-only firearms seasons are in progress on KNF (archers must hunt only bucks during bucks-only firearm seasons).
- Archers must adhere to the full Hunter Orange/Blaze Pink requirements during any firearm season for deer.
- **Vernon Unit of the Calcasieu Ranger District** (Vernon Parish, excluding Fort Polk-Vernon WMA): Sept. 17 - Jan. 15

KISATCHIE NATIONAL FOREST (cont.)

Archery - Deer Hunting:

- **Catahoula** (Grant & Rapides parishes), **Winn** (Winn, Grant & Natchitoches parishes), **Kisatchie Ranger Districts** (Natchitoches Parish), **Evangeline Unit of the Calcasieu Ranger District** (Rapides Parish), and **Caney Ranger District** (Webster & Claiborne parishes): Oct. 1 - Jan. 31.

Firearms - Deer Hunting (excludes the Catahoula and Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserves):

- **Catahoula** (Grant & Rapides parishes), **Winn** (Winn, Grant & Natchitoches parishes), **Kisatchie Ranger District** (Natchitoches Parish), **Evangeline Unit of the Calcasieu Ranger District** (Rapides Parish), and the **Vernon Unit of the Calcasieu Ranger District** (Vernon Parish, excluding Fort Polk-Vernon WMA):
 - **Youth only, either-sex:** Oct. 8-14, still hunt only. LDWF Youth Deer Hunt regulations apply **EXCEPT** that archery and open season small game hunting is allowed. LDWF regulations for Hunter Orange/Blaze Pink apply.
 - **Primitive Firearms, either-sex:** Oct. 22-23 and Dec. 31 - Jan. 1, still hunt only. LDWF Youth Deer Hunt regulations apply.
 - **Firearms, either-sex:** Oct. 29-30 and Nov. 25, still hunt only.
 - **Firearms, bucks only:** Nov. 5-24 & 26-27 and Dec. 10-25, still hunt only.
- **Caney Ranger District** (Webster and Claiborne parishes): Same as outside including Youth Hunt Only and Primitive Firearms (Area 2) **EXCEPT** still hunt only. Either-sex entire season.

Other Seasons on Entire KNF (See Catahoula/Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserve section for additional information):

- **Rabbit, Squirrel, Quail & Migratory Game Birds:** Same dates, shooting hours and bag limits as outside, **EXCEPT CLOSED** to squirrel hunting during the spring season.
- **Youth Only Squirrel:** Sept. 24-25
- **Waterfowl:** Same as outside **EXCEPT** waterfowl hunting ceases at 2 p.m. If hunting on Corney Lake (Caney Ranger District) a permit (free of charge) is required for the use of a duck blind. Contact Caney Ranger District Office for details.
- **Feral Hogs, Coyotes, Armadillos & Beavers:** May be taken during daylight hours on any KNF hunt by properly licensed hunters with weapons legal for that hunt.
- **Raccoons, Opossum & Fox (chase only):** May be hunted during daylight or nighttime from Oct. 1 - Feb. 28 only unless otherwise stated. A licensed hunter may take raccoon or opossum, two per person per day, **EXCEPT** during the trapping season when there shall be no limit. (See Louisiana Trapping Regulations pamphlet for additional information. Also see "Hunting Dog Usage During Deer Firearm Seasons" section below for exceptions).
- **Bobcat and Nutria:** LDWF regulations apply.
- **Crows, Blackbirds, Grackles & Cowbirds:** May be taken Sept. 1 - Jan. 1 only.
- **Turkey:** Caney Ranger District: April 1-16. All remaining KNF lands: April 1-23.
 - **Youth Only:** March 25-26 on all Ranger Districts (except Vernon Unit lands within Fort Polk-Vernon WMA).
- **Fishing:** LDWF State Creel Limits apply (See Louisiana Fishing Regulations pamphlet for additional information).
- **Trapping:** Same as outside, see LA Trapping Pamphlet for additional information.

Hunting Dogs Usage:

- **Hunting Dog Usage During Deer Firearm Seasons** (only for KNF areas outside Catahoula and Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserves): Hunting dogs that are legal for hunting species other than deer, and that stay within voice-command distance of handler are allowed during deer gun hunts. Hunting dogs that range beyond voice-command distance of handler are prohibited during deer gun hunts. The training of deer or hog dogs is prohibited year-round.

KISATCHIE NATIONAL FOREST (cont.)

Hunting Dogs Usage:

- Hunting with recognized bird-hunting dogs during quail and woodcock seasons, recognized raccoon-hunting dogs during raccoon hunting season and recognized pointer/retriever dogs during migratory bird season is permissible. Only beagles which do not exceed 15 inches at the front shoulder may be used for rabbit hunting. All dogs must be collared with owner's name and phone number attached. Dogs running at large are prohibited. The owner/handler shall be liable.
- **Hog hunting with dogs is NOT allowed on KNF.** Contact your local ranger district office for additional information.
- **Hunting Dog Training:** From March 1 - Sept. 30, **EXCEPT** ALL dogs prohibited during Turkey Hunting Season. Allowed only in the following circumstances: dogs are within voice-command distance of handler; dogs are participating in Nighttime Raccoon Chases mentioned below; dogs are participating in licensed events conducted by nationally recognized kennel clubs (KNF permit required - contact Forest Supervisor's office); dogs are under close control of hikers; and any dog on a leash. No firearms allowed while training dogs. Hunting dog training prohibited in Catahoula and Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserves.
- **Hunting Dog Nighttime Chase Only:** (All breeds allowed, no deer or hog dogs). May 1 - Sept. 30, Tuesdays and Fridays only. No firearms allowed. Nighttime ATV/UTV travel is prohibited. Hunting dog nighttime chase is prohibited in Catahoula and Red Dirt National Wildlife Management Preserves during this period.
- **Bird Dog Training Area:** Only that portion of the Vernon Unit known as the Dove Field. Bird dogs may be trained year-round **EXCEPT CLOSED** during turkey season. Permit from LDWF required to use pen-raised quail.

CATAHOULA AND RED DIRT NATIONAL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT PRESERVES (NWMP)

Owner: U. S. Forest Service: (Catahoula NWMP - 36,000 acres in Grant and Winn parishes; Red Dirt NWMP - 38,000 acres in Natchitoches Parish)

Season Permit required for hunting, fishing, and/or trapping on the preserve. For a permit or to get additional information contact the Forest Supervisor's office, Winn, Catahoula or Kisatchie Ranger District offices, or www.fs.usda.gov/Internet/FSE_DOCUMENTS/fseprd1009691.pdf. In addition to the Season Permit a Self Clearing Daily Permit is required for all hunters during all deer gun hunts and turkey hunts. The self-clearing daily permits will be available at the main check stations, hunter camps within the NWMP, Kisatchie, Winn and Catahoula district offices, and at the Forest Supervisor's Office. Permits are free of charge.

NOTE: The self-clearing permit consists of two portions; check-in and check-out. The check-in portion must be completed and put in the permit box before each hunt on the day of the hunt. The check-out portion must be carried by each person while on the preserve and must be completed and put in the permit box at the end of the day's hunt.

When Mandatory Deer Checks are specified (see below), all hunters must check deer at the NWMP's main check station.

Hunting with Dogs: Hunting with recognized bird-hunting dogs during quail and woodcock seasons, recognized raccoon-hunting dogs during raccoon hunting season and recognized pointer/retriever dogs during migratory bird season is permissible. Only beagles which do not exceed 15 inches at the front shoulder may be used for rabbit hunting. All dogs must be collared with owner's name and phone number attached. Dogs running at large are prohibited. The owner/handler shall be liable. No training of dogs in the NWMPs outside of pertinent seasons.

Select Prohibitions: Additional information and prohibitions provided on season permit for NWMPs.

Deer Archery Season: Same as Area 2. Archers are required to check harvested deer in/out at the check station during the mandatory deer check days (see dates below).

Special Youth Only Deer Hunt (either-sex): Oct. 8-14, still hunt only. Self-clearing daily permit required.

- LDWF Youth Deer Hunt regulations apply **EXCEPT** that archery hunting is allowed.
- LDWF WMA regulations for Hunter Orange/Blaze Pink apply.

Physically Challenged Deer Hunt (either-sex): Oct. 8-9, still hunt only. Self-clearing daily permit required. Hunters must also have in possession an LDWF Physically Challenged Hunters Permit.

Deer Primitive Firearms (either-sex): Oct. 22-23, still-hunt only. Self-clearing daily permit required. Mandatory deer check at main check stations.

Deer Firearms (either-sex): Oct. 29-30 and Nov. 25, still-hunt only. Self-clearing daily permit required. Mandatory deer check at main check stations.

Deer Firearms (bucks only): Nov. 26-27, still-hunt only. Self-clearing daily permit required.

Turkey: April 1-23

- **Youth Only:** March 25-26

NOTE: Self-clearing permit required to hunt turkey on NWMPs.

CATAHOULA AND RED DIRT NATIONAL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT PRESERVES (NWMP) (cont.)

Squirrel, Rabbit, Quail, Dove, Woodcock and Waterfowl (without dogs): All seasons same as outside (unless otherwise stated) **EXCEPT CLOSED** during deer firearm hunts. Consult LDWF hunting pamphlet for additional information. No spring squirrel season.

Youth Only Squirrel: Sept. 24-25

Squirrel and Rabbit (with dogs): Jan. 7 - Feb. 28

Raccoon (nighttime, with dogs): Jan. 7 - Feb. 28

Quail (with dogs): Nov. 19 - Feb. 28

Raccoon and Opossum (non-dog season/daylight hours): May be taken by properly licensed hunters as incidental take with gear legal for the season in progress.

Fishing: LDWF state creel limits apply. The preserve will be closed to fishing during deer gun hunts.

Trapping: See LDWF Trapping Regulations pamphlet.

USACE - INDIAN BAYOU AREA

Owner: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (28,500 acres within St. Martin and St. Landry parishes)

Additional permit required and posted restrictions apply for all persons regardless of age. Permits must be signed prior to hunting any game and must be carried at all times while in the field. To obtain a permit:

- visit the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System Project Office, 112 Speck Lane, Port Barre, LA 70577.
- phone: 337-585-0853.
- visit the project website at www.mvn.usace.army.mil/Missions/Recreation/Atchafalaya-Basin.

All hunting shall be still hunting only, **EXCEPT** as otherwise specified.

Consult U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' "Hunting Guide to Indian Bayou" brochure for additional posted restrictions.

Daily limit on deer is one per day.

Antler Deer Point Restriction: A legal buck shall be defined as a deer with at least four points on one side or a deer with unbranched antlers commonly referred to as spikes (no minimum length). To be counted as a point, a projection must be at least one inch long and its length must exceed the length of its base. The beam tip is counted as a point but not measured as a point.

Deer Archery (bucks only): Oct. 1-15

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 16 - Feb. 15

Deer Firearms (either-sex): Nov. 25-27 and Dec. 3-4, mandatory deer check.

Deer Firearms (bucks only): Dec. 31 - Jan. 8, mandatory deer check.

Deer Primitive Firearms (either-sex): Dec. 10-11

Deer Youth and Physically Challenged (either-sex): Oct. 29-30 and Nov. 5-6. No antler restrictions. Mandatory Deer Check. All other seasons **CLOSED**.

Deer Youth Lottery: Nov. 19 and Dec. 17 & 21. Contact Project Office for details.

USACE - INDIAN BAYOU AREA (cont.)

Turkey: CLOSED

Small Game, Migratory Game Birds and Waterfowl: Same as outside **EXCEPT CLOSED** Oct. 29-30, Nov. 5-6, Nov. 25-27 and Dec. 3-4 (**EXCEPT** waterfowl season will remain open during all Deer Gun hunts). Hunting waterfowl after 2 p.m. prohibited. Squirrel and rabbit hunting with dogs allowed Jan. 14 - Feb. 28. No spring squirrel season.

- **Youth Squirrel Hunt:** Sept. 24-25

Raccoon (nighttime): Sept. 10-25 and Jan. 16 - Feb. 28. Special use permit required.

Feral Hogs, Coyotes, Beaver, Armadillos and Nutria: May be taken incidental to any hunt with gear legal for that hunt.

USACE - OLD RIVER CONTROL & LOCK AREA

Owner: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (2,699 acres within Pointe Coupee, West Feliciana and Concordia parishes)

Additional permit required and posted restrictions apply for all persons regardless of age. Permits must be signed prior to hunting any game and must be carried at all times while in the field. To obtain a permit:

All hunting shall be still hunting only, except as otherwise specified.

Archery, Primitive Firearms and Shotgun only.

Deer Youth (either-sex) - 17 yrs. & under: Oct. 29-30

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 1 - Jan. 31

Deer Muzzleloader - Blackpowder Only (either-sex): Dec. 10-11

Deer Shotgun (either-sex): Nov. 25-27

Deer Shotgun (bucks only): Dec. 24 - Jan. 1

Turkey: April 1-9

Small Game, Migratory Game Birds and Waterfowl: Same as outside, **EXCEPT** hunting waterfowl after 2 p.m. prohibited, no firearms larger than .22 caliber rimfire, and **EXCEPT** hunting squirrel and rabbit with dogs allowed Nov. 28 - Dec. 9 and Jan. 2 - Feb. 28.

Woodcock: Same as outside **EXCEPT** hunting with dogs prohibited Dec. 18 - Jan. 2.

Raccoon (nighttime): Nov. 28 - Dec. 9 and Jan. 2 - Feb. 28

Feral Hogs: May be taken by properly licensed hunters from Oct. 1 - Feb. 28.

USACE - BONNET CARRE SPILLWAY

Owner: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (7,623 acres within St. Charles Parish)

Additional permit required and posted restrictions apply for all persons regardless of age. Permits must be signed prior to hunting any game and must be carried at all times while in the field. For more information, see bulletin boards on-site, visit the project website at www.mvn.usace.army.mil/Missions/Recreation/Bonnet-Carre-Spillway, or contact the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Bonnet Carre Spillway Project Office at 985-764-7484 for more information. All hunting shall be still hunting only, **EXCEPT** as otherwise specified. Deer and hog dogs prohibited year-round.

USACE - BONNET CARRE SPILLWAY (cont.)

DEER NOTES: Archery and Shotgun (buckshot) only.

Deer Archery (bucks only): Oct. 1-15

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 16 - Feb. 15

Deer Shotgun (either-sex): Nov. 25-27

Deer Shotgun (bucks only): Dec. 17 - Jan. 1

Deer Youth (either-sex): Oct. 29-30. Additional permit required from Spillway office.

Small Game, Migratory Game Birds and Waterfowl: Same as outside. Shotgun only. Hunting waterfowl after 12 p.m. (noon) prohibited. During shotgun deer season, use of dogs allowed for waterfowl hunting only.

ATTENTION:

- **Dove Hunters:** the Bonnet Carre Spillway is included in the South Hunt Zone.
- **Waterfowl Hunters:** the Bonnet Carre Spillway is included in the Eastern Hunt Zone

Squirrel and Rabbit: Same as outside, **EXCEPT** hunting with dogs not allowed north of US 61 during shotgun season for deer, Nov. 25-27 and Dec. 17 - Jan. 1.

Armadillos, Beaver, Feral Hogs, Nutria, Coyote, Crows, Blackbirds and Starlings: May be taken incidental to any Spillway hunt with weapons legal for that hunt.

BARATARIA PRESERVE

Owner: National Park Service, Crown Point (22,200 acres within Jefferson Parish)

Additional Permit and regulations apply. Contact Jean Lafitte National Historical Park and Preserve at 504-689-3690 ext. 18 or www.nps.gov/jela for additional information. Hunting permit applications accepted beginning July 1. Hunting permits issued Sept 12 - Jan. 15. Hunting will be closed Dec. 24 - Jan. 1. All Barataria Preserve hunting ends on Jan. 31. All stands must be removed by Jan. 31.

Deer Archery (bucks only): Oct. 1-15

Deer Archery (either-sex): Oct. 16 - Dec. 23 and Jan. 2-31

Youth Deer Shotgun (either-sex): Oct. 29 - Nov. 6

Deer Shotgun (bucks only, unless either sex season is in progress): Nov. 21 - Dec. 23 and Jan. 2-22

Deer Shotgun (either-sex): Nov. 19-20 & 25-27 and Dec. 10-11 & 17-18

Small Game (squirrel, nutria, rabbit): Oct. 1 - Dec. 23 and Jan. 2-31

Migratory Game Birds and Waterfowl: Same as outside, **EXCEPT CLOSED** Dec. 24 - Jan. 1.

Feral Hogs: May be taken during any of the above listed seasons, by properly licensed and permitted hunters, with gear legal for the season in progress.

There are 23 National Wildlife Refuges located within Louisiana, occurring in 29 parishes and encompassing over 550,000 acres.

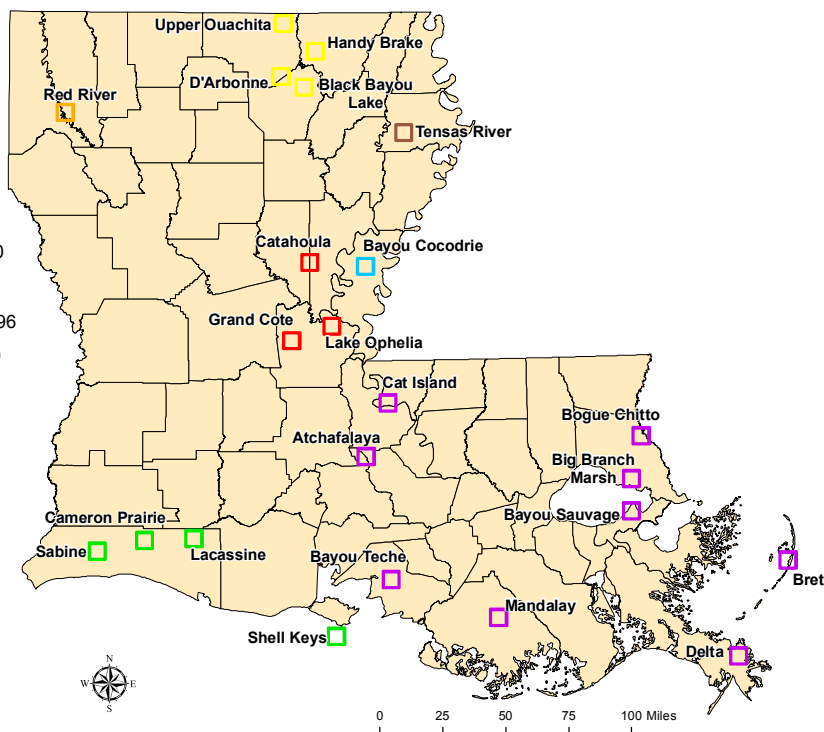

Permits or additional information may be obtained on the internet or by contacting the Refuge Complex office that administratively manages the refuge(s) you are interested in hunting.

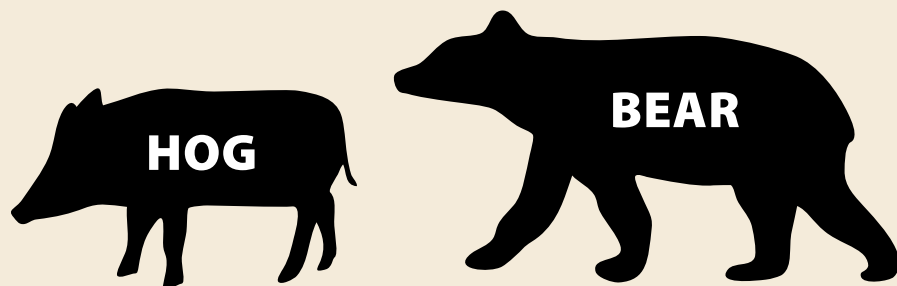

HOGS AND BEARS CAN LOOK SIMILAR

In March 2016, the Louisiana black bear was removed from the list of Federally Threatened and Endangered Species. However, bears in Louisiana are still protected under state law.

Restoration and conservation efforts of the La. Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Black Bear Conservation Coalition and many private landowners have led to increasing numbers of black bears.

Each year several Louisiana black bears are illegally killed during the hunting season. Hunters are urged to support bear conservation efforts and report illegal kills. This support will aid recovery of the Louisiana black bear and help bring about the day when legal bear hunting will once again occur in Louisiana.

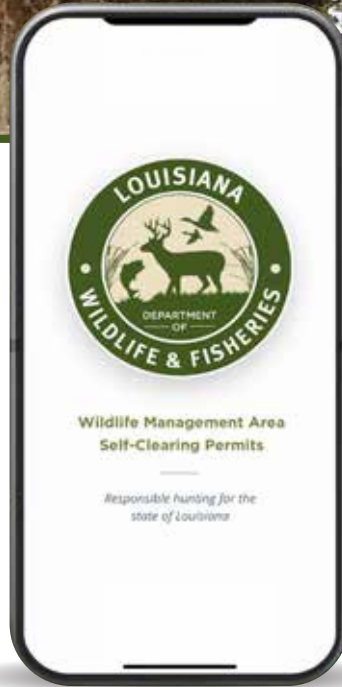
